Notice of Reprogramming Request

Pursuant to DC Code Sec 47-361-et.seq of the Reprogramming Policy Act of 1990, the Council of the District of Columbia gives notice that the Mayor has transmitted the following reprogramming request(s).

If such notice is given, a reprogramming will become effective on the 31st day after its official receipt unless a resolution of approval or disapproval is adopted by the Council prior to that time.

Reprog. 17-94: Request to reprogram \$26,017,958 of Fiscal Year 2008 local funds budget from the District of Columbia Public School (DCPS) to the Office of Public Education Facilities Modernization was filed in the Chairman's Office on February 29, 2008. The reprogramming will allow for the transfer of all assets, personnel, and funding associated with the maintenance of DCPS facilities as required under the School Modernization Use of Funds Requirements Emergency Amendment Act of 2007 and the Fiscal Year 2008 Supplemental Appropriations Emergency Act of 2007.
