Bill 17-394, the "District of Columbia Vehicle Towing, Storage, and Conveyance Fee Act of 2007" was added as an additional measure to be considered at the public hearing.**

B17-396, the "Street Sweeping Improvement Enforcement Amendment Act of 2007", amends the Fiscal Year 1997 Budget Support Act of 1996 to authorize the use of an automated parking enforcement system, and to allow recorded images of parking violations to be submitted without authentication. Additionally, it amends the District of Columbia Traffic Adjudication Act of 1978 to allow notices of infractions generated by an automated parking enforcement system to be served by mail, and further allows notices in the Fleet Adjudication Program to be served in the same manner as in the automated traffic enforcement system.

B17-394, the "District of Columbia Vehicle Towing, Storage, and Conveyance Fee Act of 2007", expands the definition of "vehicle conveyance" to include moving vehicles to a legal parking place, provides for the District to charge conveyance fees to vehicle owners liable for infractions, creates penalties if vehicle owners do not pay this conveyance fee, and authorizes the Mayor to issue implementing regulations. The bill also permits the Director of the Department of Public Works to direct a vehicle to be towed by and impounded at a facility operated by a private tow crane operator.

Councilmember Jim Graham, Chairperson of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment, will convene a second public oversight hearing to discuss the Department of Transportation's (DDOT) traffic strategies for the retail/residential development affecting Columbia Heights and Mt. Pleasant. The Committee held a previous oversight hearing on this topic on December 17, 2007. This hearing revisits this topic to address new data collected by DDOT. **This hearing notice has been abbreviated to provide notice to the public.**

The area around Columbia Heights Metro Station is undergoing rapid development. More than 750 living units, including a percentage of affordable units, and 500,000 square feet of retail are now being added to other projects completed in recent years. This development is having significant impact on traffic volume in the Columbia Heights and Mount Pleasant neighborhoods. DDOT recently completed a transportation study for Columbia Heights, and is now finalizing a plan for streetscape improvements. In addition, DDOT recently began a transportation study for Mount Pleasant. This oversight hearing will examine how the District will manage current and future traffic challenges in Columbia Heights and Mount Pleasant.
