To approve proposed rules to amend Chapter 3 of Title 23 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations to impose a 3-year moratorium on the sale of single containers of beer, malt liquor, and ale, as well as spirits (liquor) sold in half-pints or smaller volumes by the holders of Class A and B retailer's licenses located along a portion of H Street, N.E.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "H Street Moratorium Emergency Approval Resolution of 2007".

Sec. 2. Pursuant to section 25-211(b)(2) of the District of Columbia Official Code, the Mayor on June 19, 2007 transmitted to the Council proposed rules to amend Chapter 3 of Title 23 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations to impose a 3-year moratorium on the sale of single containers of beer, malt liquor, and ale, as well as spirits (liquor) sold in half-pints or smaller volumes by the holders of Class A and B retailer's licenses located along a portion of H Street, N.E. The Council approves the proposed rules.

Sec. 3. Transmittal.

The Secretary to the Council shall transmit a copy of this resolution, upon its adoption, to the Mayor and the Chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

Sec. 4. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report for the H Street Moratorium Approval Resolution of 2007, approved by the Committee on Public Works and the Environment on July 2, 2007 (Committee print of Res. 17-329), as the fiscal impact statement required by section 602(c)(3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(3)).

Sec. 5. Effective date.
