Councilmember Carol Schwartz, Chair of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment, announces a Public Hearing on Bill 16-421, the "Organ and Tissue Donor Registry Establishment Act of 2005." The Hearing will be held on Wednesday, February 8, 2006 in the Council Chamber (Suite 500) of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20004.

The purpose of Bill 16-421, which was introduced by Councilmember Catania and co-sponsored by Chairman Cropp and Councilmembers Gray, Schwartz, Mendelson, Evans, Ambrose and Brown, is to establish an organ and tissue donor registry, require that the federally designated organ procurement organization maintain the registry and require the Department of Motor Vehicles to transfer donor information to the registry on an established basis to ensure that the registry is maintained with accurate and up-to-date information.

Bill 16-569, the "Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Fund Act of 2005" would dedicate one-half of one percent of the retail sales tax as established in the Title 47 of the D.C. Official Code to provide additional funding for maintaining and improving the transportation system of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) to become effective upon enactment by Congress of legislation providing federal grants to WMATA for such purposes and passage of legislation by the Maryland General Assembly and the Virginia General Assembly dedicating an equivalent amount of sales tax in those jurisdictions.

Councilmember Carol Schwartz, Chair of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment, announces a Public Roundtable on Bill 16-536, the "Omnibus Parking Amendment Act of 2005." The Roundtable will be held on Thursday, January 19, 2006, in Hearing Room 412 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20004.

The purpose of Bill 16-536, which was introduced by Chairman Cropp at the request of the Mayor, is to restore reciprocal parking privileges to persons with disability parking tags or placards issued by other jurisdictions, authorize the establishment of time limitations at such reserved spaces, provide that such time restrictions be not less than twice the time established for the nearest non-reserved parking space, provide for a study concerning the number, placement and accessibility of such spaces and meters, require that persons with disability parking tags or placards comply with the time at all parking spaces once the reserved spaces are established in accordance with the study, subject to possible exceptions established by rulemaking, limit households to no more than 3 residential permit parking stickers and institute a progressive fee structure for residential parking, repeal a sightseeing bus license tax, and eliminate the Motor Vehicle Parking Agency and its authority over municipal off-street parking facilities.
