Councilmember Jim Graham, Chairperson of the Committee on Consumer and Regulatory Affairs, will convene a public roundtable on Bill 16-349, the "Professional Boxing Officials Licensing Residency Requirement Amendment Act of 2005"; Bill 16-524, the "Non-Health Related Occupations and Professions Licensure Amendment Act of 2005"; and Bill 16-556, the "Tenant Evictions Amendment Act of 2005".

Bill 16-349 would require that all referees, timekeepers, inspectors, and judges in professional boxing events under the jurisdiction of the D.C. Boxing and Wrestling Commission be residents of the District of Columbia.

Bill 16-524 would amend District Real Estate, Accountancy, and Appraisal laws to comply with minimum federal regulatory requirements. **The Council approved an emergency version of Bill 16-524 on January 4, 2006.**

Bill 16-556 would ensure that no tenant is evicted unless for the *bona fide* statutory purpose of making alterations or renovations to the rental unit which cannot safely be made while the rental unit is occupied, to ensure the absolute right of any tenant so evicted to rerent the rental unit, and, if the alterations or renovations are necessary to bring the rental unit into substantial compliance with the housing regulations, to ensure the right of any tenant so evicted to rerent the rental unit at the same rate. **The Council approved an emergency version of Bill 16-556 on December 6, 2005.**
