Councilmember Phil Mendelson, Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary, announces a public hearing on Bill 16-392, the "Emergency Access to Epinephrine Act of 2005," Bill 16-586, the "Metropolitan Police Department Applicant Obligated Services Amendment Act of 2006," and Bill 16-587, the "Office of Police Complaints Amendment Act of 2006." The hearing will be held on Tuesday, February 14, 2006, at 11:00 a.m., in Hearing Room 412 of the John A. Wilson Building located at 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. This notice has been abbreviated to permit appropriate notice to be given to the public.

The stated purpose of the Bill-16-392 is to ensure access to epinephrine by auto-injector to victims of anaphylactic shock in emergency response situations and to ensure that emergency medical technicians receive appropriate training for the use of epinephrine auto-injectors. The bill would also provide emergency medical technicians who use auto-injectors in conformity with emergency medical protocols with immunity from civil liability. The stated purpose of Bill 16-586 is to amend the Omnibus Police Reform Amendment Act of 2000 to authorize the Metropolitan Police Department to require candidates for employment as sworn officers to enter into obligated service agreements for three years. The stated purpose of Bill 16-587 is to amend Office of Citizen Complaint Review Establishment Act of 1998 to exempt from disclosure investigatory records compiled by Office of Police Complaints for active complaint cases.

The purpose of the public hearing is to receive testimony from the public and government officials on Bill 16-392, Bill 16-586, and Bill 16-587. Councilmember Carol Schwartz, Chair of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment, announces a Public Roundtable on PR 16-613, the "Commercial Driver's License and International Registration Plan Enforcement Approval Resolution of 2006," and Bill 16-565, the "Drug Offense Driving Privileges Revocation and Disqualification Amendment Act of 2005." The purpose of PR 16-613, which was introduced by Chairman Cropp at the request of the Mayor, is to amend Title 18 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations to bring the commercial driver's license requirements into conformity with federal regulations and establish a civil fine for violations of the International Registration Plan Agreement Act. Bill 16-565, which was also introduced by Chairman Cropp at the request of the Mayor, would amend the District of Columbia Traffic Act of 1925 to require that drug offense conviction information include a social security number and driver's license number.
