Councilmember Phil Mendelson, Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary, announces a public oversight hearing on Emergency Medical Services. The hearing will be held on Thursday, May 11, 2006, at 11 a.m., in the Council Chamber of the John A. Wilson Building.

The purpose of this oversight hearing is look at how the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department delivers emergency medical services in the District of Columbia and how the system of service delivery can be improved. The hearing will focus on, among other things, the prioritization of emergency medical calls, the availability and number of advance life support providers, the number of emergency transport vehicles, and the training of Fire and Emergency Medical Services personnel.

Individuals should limit their testimony to five minutes; less time will be allowed if there are a large number of witnesses.

Councilmember Sharon Ambrose, Chairperson of the Committee on Economic Development, announces a Public Roundtable on Bill 16-655, the "AWC and NCRC Debt Acquisition Delegation Authority Amendment Act of 2006". The Public Roundtable will be held on Wednesday, April 12, 2006, starting at 1:00 pm, or immediately following the Committee's FY 2007 Budget Hearing, in the Council Chambers at the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20004.

The purpose of this Public Roundtable is to receive testimony on Bill 16-655. This bill would permit the AWC and the NCRC to incur debt obligations after an expedited Council review process. The passage of this legislation will permit the transfer of property from NCRC to AWC to move forward more quickly.
