Orange, Sr., Chairperson of the Committee on Government Operations, announces a Public Roundtable on Bill 16-747, the "District of Columbia Open Government Meetings Act of 2006". The Public Roundtable will be held on Thursday, June 1, 2006 at 11:00 a.m., in Room 412, John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

**Bill 16-747** proposes to amend the District of Columbia Administrative Procedures Act to require that meetings of government bodies and entities be open to the public; to establish exemptions to the open meetings requirement; to establish notice requirements for public meetings; to establish meetings procedures, including procedures for closing meetings and recording meetings; and to establish an enforcement mechanism for members of the public in order to ensure that meetings are open to the public.

Councilmember Jim Graham, Chairperson of the Committee on Consumer and Regulatory Affairs, will convene Public Roundtables to discuss Bill 16-0724, the "Low-Income Disabled Tenant Rental Conversion Protection Amendment Act of 2006", Bill 16-0757, the "Independent Office of the Tenant Advocate Establishment Act of 2006", and Bill 16-0756, the "Mandatory Suspension for Alcohol Sales to Minors Act of 2006".

Bill 16-0724 would amend the Rental Housing Conversion and Sale Act of 1980 to prevent low-income disabled tenants from being involuntarily displaced when their rental housing is converted.

B16-0757, would amend the Fiscal Year 2006 Budget Support Act of 2005 to establish an independent Office of the Tenant Advocate, effective October 1, 2007, and would also clarify that the Housing Assistance Fund currently managed by the Office of the Tenant Advocate shall be managed by the independent Office of the Tenant Advocate upon independence.

Bill 16-0756 would amend Chapter 7 of Title 25 of the D.C. Official Code to require a minimum 3-day, maximum 30-day, suspension for licensees that sell or provide alcohol to minors; and would prohibit the staying of suspensions levied on licensees for the sale or provision of alcohol to minors.

The Committee invites the public to testify or to submit written testimony, which will be made a part of the official record.
