
ORIGINATING AGENCY: Office of the Mayor

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(11) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22(11) (2001), and pursuant to 19 DCMR § 1301.8 (June 2001), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. Commencing Tuesday, April 18, 2006, from 6:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m., the streets known as "E" Street, N.W., and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., between 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup> Streets, N.W., to the north and south of Freedom Plaza, together with Freedom Plaza, are hereby designated as a Special Event Area, to be used as an exhibit area for the Earth Day Celebration, "Holistic Energy Day". The E Street area shall be closed to motor vehicle traffic, except for such vehicles as may be exhibited or expressly authorized to enter, and the Pennsylvania Avenue area shall be partially closed to motor vehicle traffic to facilitate the loading and off loading of attendees, materials and supplies to Freedom Plaza, (i.e., curb lane).
2. Commencing April 18, 2006, from 6:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m., the streets known as "E" Street, N.W. between 13<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Streets, N.W., along the entire north side in the parking lane, will be closed to public parking and reserved for parking for members of the Council of the District of Columbia.
3. Commencing April 18, 2006, from 6:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m., the street known as 13<sup>th</sup> Street, between E Street and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., on the east side of Freedom Plaza, in the travel lane closest to Freedom Plaza, will be closed to vehicle traffic, except for such vehicles as may be exhibited and are expressly authorized to enter therein.
4. The D.C. Energy Office (DCEO) shall be authorized to operate and oversee this "Holistic Energy Day" event and set up exhibits and alternative fuel vehicle demonstrations in this designated special event area during the times specified in this order.

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5. In the event that any part or all of the said "Holistic Energy Day" is interrupted by adverse conditions on Tuesday, April 18, 2006, DCEO shall be authorized to use Friday, April 21, 2006, as the alternative day for the "Holistic Energy Day" event, under the terms and conditions described in paragraphs 1-4.





The Chief Financial Officer of the District of Columbia is delegated the authority vested in the Mayor to execute and deliver any documents, leases, agreements, statements, etcetera, required or incidental to the Fiscal Year 2006 issuance of Certificates of Participation that evidence proportionate interests in the payments by the District of Columbia pursuant to the lease or leases for certain real property located at Lot 815 in Square 650N, also known as 95 M Street, S.W., Washington, D.C., and all improvements now or hereinafter existing on said real property, which shall constitute the site of a facility to house driver licensing, vehicular registration and other operations of the Department of Motor Vehicles.
2. In the absence or disability of the Chief Financial Officer, the Deputy Chief Financial Officer for Finance and Treasury and Treasurer of the District of Columbia is delegated the authority to execute the powers and duties of the Chief Financial Officer as provided in this Order.

**SUBJECT:** Establishment – Advisory Committee to the Office of Gay,  
Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Affairs

**ORIGINATING AGENCY:** Office of the Mayor

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(2) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, as amended, Pub. L. No. 93-198, 87 Stat. 790, D.C. Official Code §1-204.22(12) (2001), and pursuant to section 3(b) of the Office of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Affairs Act of 2006, effective April 4, 2006 (D.C. Law 16-89; 53 DCR 1084), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

**I. ESTABLISHMENT**

There is hereby established in the Executive Branch of the Government of the District of Columbia, the Advisory Committee to the Office of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Affairs (hereinafter referred to as the ("Committee").

**II. PURPOSE**

The Committee shall advise the Mayor and the Director, Office of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Affairs, on issues relating to the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community.

**III. FUNCTIONS**

The functions of the Committee shall include:

- a. Advising on issues relating to the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community;
- b. Making recommendations on the direction and focus of the Office of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Affairs;
- c. Advising on issues relating to the mission of the Office of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Affairs; and

- d. Undertaking other duties as assigned by the Mayor, or his designee.

#### IV. COMPOSITION

- a. The Committee shall be composed of no more than twenty (25) members appointed by the Mayor.
- b. The members appointed to the Committee shall be representative of the diversity of people and ideas within the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community, and include representation from the following:
  1. The gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community; and
  2. Organizations representing health, social service, religious and human rights issues in the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community in the District.
- c. The members of the Committee shall also be selected to represent the economic, religious, race, ethnicity, gender identification, age and family status of the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community in the District.
- d. The Director of the Office of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Affairs shall serve as an ex officio member, and advisor, of the Committee.

#### V. TERMS

- a. The Mayor shall appoint the members of the Committee for a two (2) year term, except that of the first appointed members, whereby twelve (12) shall be appointed for a one (1) year term and thirteen (13) shall be appointed for a two (2) year term.
- b. The date on which the first members are installed, or sworn-in, shall become the anniversary date for all subsequent appointments.
- c. A member appointed to fill an unexpired term shall serve for the remainder of that term.
- d. A member may be appointed to successive terms.
- e. A member may hold over after the member's term expires until reappointed or replaced.

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- f. The Chairperson may excuse a member from a meeting for an emergency reason.
- g. The Mayor may remove any member who fails to attend three (3) unexcused, consecutive meetings of the Committee.
- h. A member may be removed by the Mayor for personal misconduct, neglect of duty, conflict of interest violations, incompetence, or official misconduct. Prior to removal, the public member shall be given a copy of any charges and an opportunity to respond within 10 business days following receipt of the charges. Upon a review of the charges and the response, the Director of the Office of Boards and Commissions, Executive Office of the Mayor, shall refer the matter to the Mayor with a recommendation for a final decision or disposition. A public member shall be suspended by the Director of the Office of Boards and Commissions, Executive Office of the Mayor, on behalf of the Mayor.

## **VI. COMPENSATION**

All members of the Committee shall serve without compensation, except that a member of the Committee may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred in the authorized execution of official Committee duties, if approved in advance by the Director, Office of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Affairs, or designee, and subject to the availability of appropriations.

## **VII. ORGANIZATION**

- a. The Mayor shall appoint a Chairperson and a Vice Chairperson who shall serve a one (1) year term. A Chairperson and Vice Chairperson may be reappointed to consecutive terms of office.
- b. The Committee may elect such other officers as may be required and its members deem appropriate.
- c. The Committee shall establish its own schedule of meetings, except that it shall convene at least two (2) meetings each year.
- d. The Committee may establish its own bylaws and rules of procedure, subject to the approval of the Mayor, or his designee.
- e. The Committee may establish such subcommittees as it deems appropriate.
- f. There shall be no voting by proxy.

**VIII. ADMINISTRATION**

The Office of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Affairs shall provide administrative and technical support to the Committee.

**IX. SUNSET**

The Committee shall sunset on March 31, 2012.

**X. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Order shall become effective immediately.

L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code §§ 1-204.22(2), (3), (6) and (11)(2001), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

**1A. ESTABLISHMENT:**

There is established in the Executive Office of the Mayor, under the direction, and control of the Mayor, the Office of Baseball (the "Office").

**1B. PURPOSE:**

The purpose of the Office is to assist and advise the Mayor in the review, planning, coordination and oversight of the construction and development of the new ballpark and the surrounding mixed use district and to coordination the development activities on the ballpark site and in the surrounding area among the affected District agencies and instrumentalities in order to maximize the benefits of the public investment in the stadium complex.

The presence of a ballpark in the District of Columbia (the "District") will add the greatest value to the District and the residents of the District if the ballpark is built and developed in conjunction with the development of a surrounding mixed use residential, commercial, retail and entertainment district. The development of this mixed-use district will require substantial cooperation and coordination among the District government and its agencies and instrumentalities, including the District of Columbia Sports and Entertainment Commission (the "DCSEC") and the Anacostia Waterfront Corporation (the "AWC"), and the Washington Nationals Major League Baseball Club (the "Team"). Coordination among the District government and its agencies and instrumentalities, including the DCSEC and the AWC, and the Team will improve the quality and integration of the development of the ballpark site and the surrounding area and will maximize revenues both to the Community Benefit Fund and General Fund of the District as well as generate revenue to pay for desired infrastructure.

**1C. FUNCTIONS:**

Acting through the Director of the Office (the "Director"), the Office shall:

- a. Assist the Mayor to maximize planning and coordination in the development and construction on the ballpark site and the surrounding mixed-use district among the District government and its agencies and instrumentalities, including the DCSEC and the AWC, and the Team. This coordination will ensure budget goals and deadlines are met, that the agreements among the District government and its agencies and instrumentalities, including the DCSEC and the AWC, and the Team are met, and that revenues from the ballpark site and the surrounding mixed-use district are maximized and used for those purposes which best achieve the District's goals.
- b. Ensure coordination of District inter-agency activities in support of the ballpark project, including, but not limited to, the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs, the Office of Planning, the Department of Health, the Department of Public Works, the Metropolitan Police Department, the Department of Transportation, the Office of Local Business Development and the Department of Employment Services.
- c. Ensure coordination of transportation infrastructure improvements and their timely completion with the parties developing and constructing the ballpark and transit agencies including the District Department of Transportation and the Washington Metropolitan Transit Authority.
- d. Ensure fiscal responsibility on the ballpark construction project through coordination with the Office of the Chief Financial Officer and the DCSEC and review, on behalf of the Mayor, monthly and other project budget and progress reports from the DCSEC.
- e. Ensure that the DCSEC, in coordination with the Office of Local Business Development and the Department of Employment Services, is meeting or exceeding statutory hiring and contracting requirements.
- f. Coordinate briefings and project updates with the City Council.
- g. Monitor the delivery of community benefit obligations and programs including but not limited to those outlined in the agreements among the District government and its agencies and instrumentalities, including the DCSEC and the AWC, Major League Baseball and the Team.

- h. When appropriate, submit to the Mayor written updates on the aforementioned activities and any relevant recommendations for Mayoral action.
- i. When appropriate, submit to the heads of the agencies, instrumentalities and entities mentioned herein recommendations to achieve the aforementioned goals.
- j. When appropriate, submit to the Mayor updates on the actions recommended in (i.).

**1D. ORGANIZATION:**

The Office shall be headed by a Director, who shall report to the Mayor. The Mayor shall appoint a Director, who will serve at the Mayor's discretion. The position of Director shall be an Excepted Service Position or an Executive Service Position within the Executive Office of the Mayor (the "EOM"). The Mayor shall provide office space and technical and administrative support to the Office.

The Mayor may by delegation, contract, or agreement direct or request that personnel or other resources of the EOM, another District department, office, agency or instrumentality, or other entity be made available to the Office to assist in carrying out the Office's duties. Personnel detailed to the Office shall remain employees of the department, office, agency or instrumentality, or other entity from which the employee is detailed but, as long as detailed to the Office, shall work at the direction of the Director. The Director shall coordinate, hire, and supervise all staff of the Office as needed to complete the mission of the Office, subject to the concurrence of the Mayor.

**2A. ESTABLISHMENT:**

There is established in the Office of Baseball the Baseball Advisory Committee (the "Committee").

**2B. PURPOSE:**

The purpose of the Committee shall be to advise the Mayor and the Director of the Office of Baseball on the coordination and oversight of the construction and development of the new baseball stadium and the surrounding area.

**2C. FUNCTIONS:**

The Committee will provide advice and recommendations to the Mayor on policy issues and provide guidance and direction to the Director of the Office of Baseball. The Committee shall advise the Mayor and the Director of the Office of Baseball with regard to all the functions to be conducted by the Office of Baseball.

**2D. COMPOSITION:**

The Committee members shall serve on the Committee during their tenure in office. A Committee member may designate an alternative individual to serve in his place. The Mayor will designate one Committee Member as the Chair. The Committee shall be comprised of the following members:

- a. The City Administrator;
- b. The Chairman of the Board of the Anacostia Waterfront Corporation;
- c. The Chairman of the Board of the District of Columbia Sports and Entertainment Commission; and
- d. A representative of the Washington Nationals Baseball Club or its successor, such representative to be designated by the Washington Nationals Baseball Club or its successor.

**2E. ORGANIZATION AND PROCEDURES:**

The Committee Chair shall call meetings of the Committee as necessary and desirable. Any member of the Committee may request that the Committee Chair call a meeting. Meetings shall be held at the location designated by the Committee Chair, and members shall receive notice of the date, time, location and agenda for the next meeting not less than three (3) days before the meeting.

**2F. COMPENSATION:**

The members of the Committee shall serve without compensation. Expenses of the Committee as a whole and of individual members, when authorized in advance by the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development, and subject to availability, may be reimbursed.

**2G. ADMINISTRATION:**

The Office of Baseball shall provide administrative, staff and technical support to the Committee.

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
3. SUNSET:

Law 15-194, D.C. Official Code § 5-129.51(d) (2005 Supp.).
2. The Chief, Metropolitan Police Department, is delegated the Mayor's authority to promulgate regulations under the Volunteer Services Act of 1977, effective June 28, 1977, D.C. Law 2-12, D.C. Official Code § 1-319.02 (2001) for volunteers in the Reserve Corps.
3. This Order supersedes Mayor's Order 77-168, dated October 7, 1977 only with respect to volunteers in the Reserve Corps.

**SUBJECT:** Designation of the Office of Risk Management to Coordinate the Americans with Disabilities Act Compliance Program in the District of Columbia and Assignment of Related Responsibilities to Other District Government Agencies

**ORIGINATING AGENCY:** Office of the Mayor

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(11) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22(11) (2001), and in accordance with the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), approved July 26, 1990, 104 Stat. 327, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 *et seq.*, it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Order is to designate an agency of the District of Columbia government as the coordinating agency for ADA purposes and to establish compliance and monitoring procedures for the District-wide implementation of the ADA. Regulation of this federal law will be accompanied by the provision of technical assistance to business and government entities that must comply so that people with disabilities in the District of Columbia are afforded the rights provided by the ADA.

II. DESIGNATION

The Office of Risk Management (ORM) is hereby designated to coordinate and enforce compliance with the ADA in the District of Columbia.

III. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS OF THE ADA

A. Title I Compliance - Employment

Title I of the ADA prohibits discrimination against qualified individuals with disabilities in job application procedures, hiring, firing, advancement, compensation, job training, and other terms, conditions and privileges of employment. The prohibition applies to recruitment, advertising, tenure; layoff, leave, fringe benefits, and all other employment-related activities.

B. Title II Compliance - State and Local Governments

Title II of the ADA prohibits discrimination against qualified individuals with disabilities in all programs, activities, and services of public entities.

The prohibition applies to all states and local governments, their departments and agencies, and any other instrumentalities or special purpose districts of state and local governments. Title II extends the prohibition of discrimination in federally assisted programs established by section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. § 794) to all activities of state and local governments, including those that do not receive federal financial assistance, and incorporates specific prohibitions of discrimination on the basis of disability from Titles I, III, and V of the ADA.

C. Title III Compliance - Public Accommodations

Title III of the ADA prohibits discrimination by private entities that own, lease, lease to, or operate a place of public accommodation against qualified individuals with disabilities. Places of public accommodation include a wide range of entities, including restaurants, hotels, theaters, doctors' offices, retail stores, museums, private schools, and day care centers. Private clubs and religious organizations are exempt from the public accommodation requirements of Title III. Physical barriers in existing facilities must be removed, if removal is readily achievable. If not, alternative methods of providing the service, if they are readily achievable, must be offered. Auxiliary aids and services must be provided unless doing so would result in an undue burden or in a fundamental alteration in the nature of the goods or services provided.

D. Title IV Compliance - Telecommunications Relay Service

Title IV of the ADA requires companies offering telephone services to the general public to establish telephone relay services for individuals who use telecommunications devices for deaf persons (TDD's) or similar devices. State and local agencies that provide emergency telephone services must provide direct access to individuals who rely on a TDD or computer modem for telephone communication.

IV. FUNCTIONS

A. All District of Columbia agencies shall:

1. Appoint an agency ADA Coordinator;
2. Complete an ADA self-evaluation to determine the status of ADA compliance;
3. Prepare an ADA transition plan stating action to be taken to provide qualified persons with disabilities in the District of

Columbia full and complete access to services, activities, and facilities;

4. Prepare annual ADA implementation plan update; and
5. Submit ADA self-evaluation and initial transition plan for approval to ORM, 441 4<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., by December 31, 2006. Thereafter, annual transition plan updates are to be submitted by December 31 of each succeeding year.

B. Specified Agency Functions

1. The Office of Risk Management shall

- a. Be responsible for providing technical assistance to government and non-government entities regarding compliance with Title I of the ADA;
- b. Be responsible for coordinating the District government program to comply with Title II of the ADA;
- c. Provide technical assistance to the Public Service Commission, which is responsible for ensuring that companies offering telephone services to the general public comply with Title IV of the ADA;
- d. Appoint a District-wide ADA Coordinator; and
- e. Provide technical assistance to all agencies in interpreting the provisions of Title II of the ADA, including the development of ADA self-evaluation forms, transition plans, and annual implementation plan updates.

2. The Office of Human Rights shall:

- a. Provide (i) awareness and sensitivity training to employers to encourage the hiring of persons with disabilities and (ii) technical assistance to employers regarding reasonable accommodations for employees with disabilities;
- b. Answer specific questions of employers regarding available accommodations for employees with specific needs;
- c. Investigate complaints and charges of disability discrimination and enforce compliance with the ADA, the Human Rights Act of 1977 (D.C. Law 2-38; D.C. Official

Code §§ 2-1401.01 *et seq.*), and Mayor's Order No. 75-230 (October 31, 1975);

- d. Have jurisdiction over complaints and allegations of discrimination based on disability, seeking conciliation alternatives and settlement before the adjudication of liability and determination of remedies;
  - e. Take necessary and appropriate steps so that all labor, employment, and training service programs administered, implemented, or conducted by the District of Columbia government (i) are submitted to the OHR compliance officer for review and (ii) comply with the provisions of the ADA relating to program and facility accessibility; and
  - f. Take necessary and appropriate steps so that procedures for equal employment opportunity and access enforcement are adequate to protect persons with disabilities against unlawful discrimination.
3. The Office of Personnel shall:
- a. Review and modify, when necessary and appropriate, any employment criteria or tests that unlawfully screen out qualified applicants with disabilities;
  - b. Take necessary and appropriate steps so that recruitment and outreach efforts for the filling of vacancies include persons with disabilities;
  - c. Through the Office of Labor Relations and Collective Bargaining, review all contracts and agreements with labor unions, organizations providing training, and apprenticeship programs for compliance with Title I of the ADA, and to recommend changes when necessary and appropriate;
  - d. Refer qualified applicants with disabilities and ADA-related issues or concerns to government and non-governmental employers;
  - e. Review and amend, as necessary and appropriate, grievance procedures for District of Columbia government job applicants and employees with disabilities;

- f. Review and amend, as necessary and appropriate, policies on pre-employment physical examinations, so that such examinations do not discriminate unlawfully against applicants with disabilities;
  - g. Accept referrals of employees who, because of newly acquired disabilities, require assistance in job restructuring or placement into different work settings; and
  - h. Establish guidelines and review requests for reasonable accommodations.
4. The Office of Property Management shall
- a. Provide assistance with regard to the removal of existing architectural or structural barriers in buildings owned or occupied by the District government; and provide guidance and direction in the design and construction of new facilities, streets, sidewalks, ramps, or other infrastructure items, in accordance with applicable national accessibility standards;
  - b. Take necessary and appropriate measures to provide that all physical sites, buildings, and attendant facilities constructed by the District of Columbia government comply with provisions of Title II and Title III of the ADA relating to accessibility of facilities;
  - c. Take necessary and appropriate measures to provide that all physical sites, buildings, and attendant facilities proposed to be leased or purchased by the District of Columbia government comply with 29 U.S.C. § 794 and the ADA relative to accessibility of facilities; and
  - d. Provide technical assistance to non-governmental entities regarding compliance with Title III of the ADA.
5. The Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs shall
- Provide assistance to agencies in regard to the enforcement and interpretation of building codes and specifications on all properties owned or occupied by District government agencies and programs; and take appropriate measures to provide that licenses conform to applicable provisions of the ADA and that subject buildings are in compliance with applicable codes and regulations.

6. The District Department of Transportation shall
  - a. Take appropriate measures to provide for compliance with Subtitle B (public transportation) of Title II; and
  - b. Designate the District of Columbia representatives to serve on the regional Paratransit Coordinating Committee, which advises the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority regarding compliance with ADA public transportation requirements.

V. MONITORING

- A. An ADA Steering Committee shall be established to review on a quarterly basis and to approve or disapprove ADA implementation plans and updates for all agencies under the direction and authority of the Mayor. The Steering Committee will be composed of representatives of agencies designated in this Order under Paragraph IV and from the Office of the Attorney General. The Steering Committee will be chaired by the District ADA Coordinator. If agencies fail to comply with provisions of this Mayoral Order, the Steering Committee will notify the ORM Director.
- B. The Steering Committee shall prepare and submit to the City Administrator an annual report on District government ADA compliance three months after the end of each calendar year.

VI. CITIZENS ADVISORY BODY

The Mayor's Committee on Persons with Disabilities shall serve in an advisory capacity to ORM on coordinating District compliance with Title II of the ADA.

VII. APPLICABILITY: WHO MUST COMPLY

The provisions of this Order shall be applicable to every department or agency under the direction and authority of the Mayor and all other District government agencies, whether or not under the direction and authority of the Mayor, with respect to operations that serve citizens of the District of Columbia.

- VIII. Nothing in this Order is intended to create any legal rights or privileges in any third parties. This Order is also not intended to impose upon the District government any obligations other than as may apply to public entities under the ADA.

- IX. This Order repeals Mayor's Order 94-138, dated May 25, 1998.

- X. EFFECTIVE DATE: The provisions of this Order shall become effective

immediately.
