Notice of Reprogramming Request

Pursuant to DC Code Sec 47-361-et.seq of the Reprogramming Policy Act of 1990, the Council of the District of Columbia gives notice that the Mayor has transmitted the following reprogramming request(s).

A reprogramming will become effective on the 15th day after official receipt unless a Member of the Council files a notice of disapproval of the request which extends the Council's review period to 30 days. If such notice is given, a reprogramming will become effective on the 31st day after its official receipt unless a resolution of approval or disapproval is adopted by the Council prior to that time.

Reprog. 16-83: Request to reprogram \$3,000,000 of local authority from the D.C. Public Charter Schools (DCPCS) to the Anacostia Waterfront Corporation (AWC) Subsidy account was received in the Chairman's Office on June 26, 2006. The reprogramming will provide additional funding for improvements at the Reservation 13 (Hill East Waterfront) site (\$1,000,000) and the construction of the Canal Block Park project (\$2,000,000).
