Bill 16-779, introduced by Chairman Cropp at the request of the Mayor, would implement the Inclusionary Zoning Regulations adopted by the Zoning Commission for the District of Columbia, which have placed mandatory affordable housing set-aside requirements upon certain new residential developments located within an Inclusionary Zoning Overlay District to be mapped by the Zoning Commission later this year. Properties subject to the set-aside requirement for low and moderate income housing would receive additional density as a matter of right beyond the maximum otherwise permitted in the underlying zoning district.
