Bill 16-949 would amend the "Insurance Act of 1934" to partially repeal the "Uniform Sickness and Accident Policy Provision Law" (UPPL). The UPPL allows insurers to deny liability coverage and payment for any loss where the insured is found to have been intoxicated with alcohol and/or narcotics. Bill 16-949 would repeal the UPPL for sickness and accident insurance policies, while continuing to permit the exclusion in other types of insurance policies. It also would explicitly prohibit the denial on the basis of alcohol or drug-use of health care coverage that otherwise would be afforded.
