Notice of Reprogramming Request

Pursuant to DC Code Sec 47-361-et.seq of the Reprogramming Policy Act of 1990, the Council of the District of Columbia gives notice that the Mayor has transmitted the following reprogramming request(s).

A reprogramming will become effective on the 15th day after official receipt unless a Member of the Council files a notice of disapproval of the request which extends the Council's review period to 30 days. If such notice is given, a reprogramming will become effective on the 31st day after its official receipt unless a resolution of approval or disapproval is adopted by the Council prior to that time.

Reprog. 16-109: Request to reprogram \$1,467,921 of local funds budget authority from the Workforce Investment account to the Tax Increment Financing (TIF) program was received in the Chairman's Office on September 28, 2006. The reprogramming will cover a shortfall in tax revenue generated by the Gallery Place TIF program.

Reprog. 16-110: Request to reprogram \$1,911,500 of local funds budget authority within the District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS) was received in the Chairman's Office on September 28, 2006. The reprogramming will help cover higher than anticipated educational costs for wards of the District attending regular programs (not related to special education) that occur outside of the District.

The reprogramming primarily will cover overtime costs in the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department Field Operations program.

The reprogramming will reallocate budget authority to cover unanticipated costs within the recycling, nuisance abatement, and fleet management programs.

The reprogramming will reallocate budget authority to cover gaming-related expenditures consisting primarily of contractor fees, prizes for participants, agent commissions, and the transfer of revenue to the District's General Fund.
