A RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

October 3, 2006

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to define "certified business enterprise" and clarify that the dollar volume subcontracting requirement may include purchases from small business enterprises that provide materials, goods, and supplies.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Department of Small and Local Business Development Subcontracting Clarification Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. In January of this year the Council passed emergency and temporary legislation to clarify that procurement of materials, goods and supplies may count towards the satisfaction of local, small and disadvantaged business enterprise construction subcontracting requirements. The temporary act, D.C. Law 16-409, expired on September 22, 2006. In order to keep this law active, the Council must enact new emergency and temporary legislation to ensure that there is no lapse in legal authority or in rules that have already been issued to implement the clarifying changes.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Department of Small and Local Business Development Subcontracting Clarification Emergency Amendment Act of 2006 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to clarify the effective date of the estate tax filing threshold.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Estate and Inheritance Tax Clarification Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. (a) Title XIV of D.C. Law 14-307, the Fiscal Year 2003 Budget Support Amendment Act of 2002, decoupled the District's estate tax code from the federal code.

(b) Title XXI of D.C. Act 15-106, the Fiscal Year 2004 Budget Support Act of 2003, and prior emergency and temporary versions of this legislation, increased the District's filing threshold for estates to \$1,000,000, from the previous \$675,000.

(c) It was the intent of the Council in raising the estate tax filing threshold earlier this year that it would apply to decedents who die on or after January 1, 2003, and that the fiscal impact of this title was predicated upon that reading of the title.

(d) The proposed emergency legislation will make this intent clearer, and is warranted so the Office of Tax and Revenue may advise tax practitioners and residents properly as to the effect of Title XXI of D.C. Act 15-106.

(e) The prior temporary version, D.C. Law 16-0062, will expire on October 19, 2006. This emergency is necessary to ensure there is no gap in legal authority.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Estate and Inheritance Tax Clarification Emergency Act of 2006 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to amend An Act To establish and provide for the maintenance of a free public library and reading room in the District of Columbia to grant the Board of Library Trustees the authority to procure goods and services independent of the Office of Contracting and Procurement and the requirements of the District of Columbia Procurement Practices Act of 1985 ("PPA"), except for provisions of the PPA pertaining to contract protests, appeals, and claims, and to make the independent procurement authority of the Board of Library Trustees contingent upon it issuing procurement regulations that have been approved by the Council; and to amend the PPA to exempt the Board of Library Trustees from the provisions of the act except for those provisions pertaining to contract protests, appeals, and claims.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Library Procurement Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. (a) On October 3, 2006, the Council is scheduled to have its second and final reading on Bill 16-562, the Library Procurement Amendment Act of 2006.

(b) Bill 16-562 would provide the D.C. Public Library ("DCPL") with independent procurement authority, subject to certain conditions. First, DCPL would have to receive Council approval of its procurement regulations before DCPL's independent procurement authority would take effect. Second, Bill 16-562 includes a 2-year sunset provision to allow the Mayor and Council to decide if DCPL's independent procurement authority should be continued after a 2-year period.

(c) DCPL's need for independent procurement authority, as provided in Bill 16-562, is acute. Accountability for important procurements – mostly notably, those pertaining to the design and rebuilding of 4 libraries (Anacostia, Benning, Tenley-Friendship, and Watha T. Daniel) that have been closed for almost 2 years – is presently diffused and divided between DCPL and the Office of Contracting and Procurement. As DCPL prepares to launch a 6-year capital construction plan with funding of \$169.5 million, more than double the amount of the prior 6-year capital budget, it is essential that responsibility and accountability be placed in one chain of command under DCPL.

(d) Due to Congressional review, it will be impossible for Bill 16-562 to become law until next spring. A 6-month delay in independent procurement authority will hinder DCPL's efforts to fulfill its mission, necessitating enacting the provisions of Bill 16-562 on an emergency basis.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Library Procurement Emergency Amendment Act of 2006 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to clarify the period for Council review of nominations to the Commission; to abolish the Mayor's Advisory Commission on African Community Affairs as of the date that the majority of the members of the Commission on African Affairs are sworn in or December 31, 2006 whichever occurs first; and to provide for the transfer of all records of the Mayor's Advisory Commission on African Community Affairs to the Commission on African Affairs.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Office and Commission on African Affairs Clarification Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. (a) There exists an emergency regarding the need to amend the Office and Commission on African Affairs Act of 2006 to clarify the period for Council review of nominations to the Commission, to abolish the existing Commission after a majority of the members are sworn in as members of the Commission on African Affairs, and to provide for the transfer of all records of the Mayor's Advisory Commission on African Community Affairs upon a majority of the 15 public member Commission being sworn in.

(b) The Office and Commission on African Affairs Act of 2006 requires the Mayor to appoint a Commission of 15 public voting members with the advice and consent of the Council.

(c) The current law does not provide for the period for Council approval of nominations that are submitted to the Council.

(d) The Mayor will be transmitting nominations to this established Commission; therefore, the clarification amendment is necessary to clarify the review period.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Office and Commission on African Affairs Clarification Emergency Amendment Act of 2006 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to approve a multiyear contract with ACS State & Local Solutions, Inc., to manage and administer the District's parking meter assets.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Contract No. POKA-2005-C-0048-KH Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. (a) The Office of Contracting and Procurement, on behalf of the District Department of Transportation, proposes to enter into a multiyear agreement with ACS State & Local Solutions, Inc. ("ACS") to manage and administer the District's parking meter assets for 5 years from the date of award.

(b) The estimated total expenditure under this multiyear contract with ACS is \$19,734,504.08.

(c) The most recent parking meter services contract expired on August 6, 2006.

(d) These critical parking meter services can only be obtained through an award of the multiyear contract with ACS.

(e) Council approval of the ACS contract is necessary to allow the District to continue to receive the benefit of these vital services from ACS.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Contract No. POKA-2005-C-0048-KH Emergency Approval Resolution of 2006 be adopted on an emergency basis.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

To approve, on an emergency basis, multiyear Contract No. POKA-2005-C-0048-KH with ACS State & Local Solutions, Inc., to manage and administer the District's parking meter assets.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Contract No. POKA-2005-C-0048-KH Emergency Approval Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. (a) Pursuant to section 451(c)(3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 803; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.51(c)(3)), the Council approves Contract No. POKA-2005-C-0048-KH with ACS State & Local Solutions, Inc., to manage and administer the District's parking meter assets for 5 years from the date of award.

(b) The estimated total expenditure under this multiyear contract with ACS is \$19,734,504.08.

Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement provided by the Office of the Chief Financial Officer as the fiscal impact statement required by section 602(c)(3) of the Home Rule Act 87 Stat. 813; (D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(3)).

Sec. 4. The Secretary to the Council shall transmit a copy of this resolution, upon its adoption, to the Mayor.

Sec. 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to require certain records to be made available to the Child and Family Services Agency as part of an investigation of suspected abuse or neglect.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Child Abuse and Neglect Investigation Record Access Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. (a) There exists an immediate crisis regarding the investigation of suspected child abuse and neglect in the District of Columbia. This crisis is exacerbated by the increasing number of reports of suspected child abuse and neglect in the District.

(b) In order to protect the safety of the children who are the subject of these reports, and to strengthen the accuracy of decision-making, the persons investigating reports of suspected child abuse or neglect need immediate access to records concerning the child. The investigators particularly need access to records that may be held by those who are mandated by law to report suspected child abuse or neglect.

(c) Without immediate access to the records of mandated reporters, completion of an investigation may be delayed, putting children at risk of additional maltreatment. If the investigation is completed without the records, investigation results may be less than accurate, again putting children at risk of additional maltreatment.

(d) To address this crisis, the Child and Family Services Agency staff who investigate reports of suspected child abuse and neglect must have immediate access to records in the possession of a person who is required to report child abuse or neglect, or the person's employee, concerning the child who is the subject of the report or any other child in the home

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary to adopt "Child Abuse and Neglect Investigation Record Access Emergency Amendment Act of 2006" after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to relieve the financial burdens placed upon District of Columbia government employees who serve in the reserve units of the United States Armed Forces and have been or will be called to active duty as a result of Operation Enduring Freedom, or in preparation for or as a result of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom Active Duty Pay Differential Extension Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. (a) On September 14, 2001, President George W. Bush issued a proclamation, "Declaration of National Emergency by Reason of Certain Terrorist Attacks," which declared a national emergency due to the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York and the Pentagon. The resulting military operations were named Operation Enduring Freedom.

(b) On September 14, 2001, in furtherance of the aforementioned proclamation, President George W. Bush issued Executive Order 13223, ordering the Ready Reserve of the Armed Forces to active duty, in addition to providing additional authority to the Department of Defense and the Department of Transportation.

(c) The Operation Enduring Freedom Active Duty Pay Differential Emergency Amendment Act of 2001, effective January 8, 2002 (D.C. Act 14-225; 49 DCR 664), provided for payment of a pay differential for each employee called to active duty as a result of Operation Enduring Freedom. D.C. Act 14-225 specified that the pay differential would be paid for any period following the formal inception of Operation Enduring Freedom during which the employee was carried in a non-pay status, from the time the employee is called to active duty until the employee is released from active duty, or until September 30, 2002, whichever occurred first. D.C. Act 14-225 expired on April 8, 2002.

(d) The Operation Enduring Freedom Active Duty Pay Differential Temporary Amendment Act of 2002, effective April 13, 2002 (D.C. Law 14-113; 49 DCR 1416), provided for continuation of payment of a pay differential for each employee called to active duty as a result of Operation Enduring Freedom. D.C. Law 14-113 specified that the pay differential would be paid for any period following the formal inception of Operation Enduring Freedom during which the employee was carried in a non-pay status, from the time the employee is called to active duty until the employee is released from active duty, or until September 30, 2002, whichever occurred first. D.C. Law 14-113 expired on November 24, 2002.

(e) The Operation Enduring Freedom Active Duty Pay Differential Extension Emergency Amendment Act of 2002, effective October 23, 2002 (D.C. Act 14-498; 49 DCR 9795),

provided for payment of the pay differential for each employee who, as of September 30, 2002, had been called to active duty from reserve units as a result of Operation Enduring Freedom. D.C. Act 14-498 expired on December 30, 2002.

(f) The Operation Enduring Freedom conflict has not ended and, on March 19, 2003, Operation Iraqi Freedom began. Additional employees have been called to active duty as a result. Accordingly, the District of Columbia authorized a pay differential for employees called to active duty for this purpose as well as the continuation of the payment to employees called to active duty after September 30, 2002, through the enactment of Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom Active Duty Pay Differential Extension Emergency Amendment Act of 2003, effective April 16, 2003 (D.C. Act 15-74; 50 DCR 3619), and the Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom Active Duty Pay Differential Extension Temporary Amendment Act of 2003, effective May 19, 2003 (D.C. Law 15-23; 50 DCR 4339). D.C. Law 15-23 expired on March 3, 2004.

(g) The Council continued the authority for the pay differential through the enactment of the Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom Active Duty Pay Differential Extension Temporary Amendment Act of 2004, effective May 18, 2004 (D.C. Law 15-158), which expired on December 29, 2004.

(h) The Council again continued the authority for the pay differential through the enactment of Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom Active Duty Pay Differential Extension Temporary Amendment Act of 2005, effective March 8, 2006 (D.C. Law 16-64), which expires on October 19, 2006.

(i) This emergency is necessary to prevent a gap in the legal authority.

(j) The enactment of the proposed emergency will continue authority to provide a pay differential in an amount equal to any difference between the employees' basic District of Columbia government pay and their basic military pay.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom Active Duty Pay Differential Extension Emergency Amendment Act of 2006 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to approve a multiyear contract for the purchase of heating oil #2 and diesel fuel under federal contract number SPO600-05-D-4057 with Mansfield Oil Company and to authorize payment for the goods and services received and to be received under the contract.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "District of Columbia Multiyear Contract for the Purchase of Fuel under Federal Contract No. SP0600-05-D-4057 Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. (a) There exists an immediate need to approve the multiyear contract for the purchase of heating oil #2 and diesel fuel under federal Contract No. SPO600-05-D-4057 for various District agencies and to authorize payment for the fuel received and to be received under this federal contract.

(b) The Office of Property Management ("OPM"), is responsible for providing various District agencies with diesel fuel, unleaded gasoline, and fuel oil #2 which are used for heating District office facilities and maintaining the vehicle fleets of the Fire Department, Metropolitan Police Department, and the Department of Public Works.

(c) In November 2004, the OPM submitted its requirements for diesel fuel, unleaded gasoline, and fuel oil #2 to the Defense Logistics Agency, Defense Energy Support Center ("DESC") for inclusion in its solicitation that was issued in February 2005.

(d) On September 29, 2005, DESC awarded Contract No. SP0600-05-D-4057 to Mansfield Oil Company ("Mansfield") to provide heating oil #2 and diesel fuel from October 1, 2005, until August 30, 2010. The requirements of several District agencies for heating oil #2 and diesel fuel are included in the contract award to Mansfield.

(e) Under various delivery orders issued by the Office of Contracting and Procurement, Mansfield provided heating oil #2 and diesel fuel from October 1, 2005, through June 23, 2006. From October 1, 2005, through June 23, 2006, expenditures under delivery orders issued under this contract were approximately \$945,618.00. The Office of Contracting and Procurement did not request Council approval for the multiyear contract.

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(f) Council approval is necessary to authorize the multiyear agreement, the delivery orders issued under this contract, and to approve payment to Mansfield for the heating oil #2 and diesel fuel provided between October 1, 2005 and June 23, 2006.

(g) The estimated total expenditure under this multiyear contract with Mansfield is \$7,291,582.20.

(h) Council approval is necessary to allow the District to continue to receive the benefit of these vital goods and services from Mansfield.

Sec. 3. The Council determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the District of Columbia Multiyear Contract for the Purchase of Fuel under Federal Contract No. SP0600-05-D-4057 Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Act of 2006 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to approve a multiyear contract for the purchase of regular unleaded gasoline under federal contract number SPO600-05-D-4058 with Ohio Energy Specialties, Inc., and to authorize payment for the goods and services received and to be received under the contract.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "District of Columbia Multiyear Contract for the Purchase of Fuel under Federal Contract No. SP0600-05-D-4058 Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. (a) There exists an immediate need to approve the multiyear contract for the purchase of regular unleaded gasoline under federal Contract No. SPO600-05-D-4058 for various District agencies and to authorize payment for the fuel received and to be received under this federal contract.

(b) The Office of Property Management ("OPM"), is responsible for providing various District agencies with diesel fuel, unleaded gasoline, and fuel oil #2, which are used for heating District office facilities and maintaining the vehicle fleets of the Fire Department, Metropolitan Police Department, and the Department of Public Works.

(c) In November 2004, the OPM submitted its requirements for diesel fuel, unleaded gasoline, and fuel oil #2 to the Defense Logistics Agency, Defense Energy Support Center ("DESC") for inclusion in its solicitation that was issued in February 2005.

(d) On September 29, 2005, DESC awarded Contract No. SP0600-05-D-4058 to Ohio Energy Specialties, Inc. ("Ohio") to provide regular unleaded gasoline from October 1, 2005, until July 31, 2010. OPM's requirements for regular unleaded gasoline were included in the award to Ohio.

(e) Under various purchase orders issued by the Office of Contracting and Procurement, Ohio provided regular unleaded gasoline from October 1, 2005, through June 23, 2006. From October 1, 2005, through June 23, 2006 expenditures under purchase orders issued under this contract were approximately \$510,000.00. The Office of Contracting and Procurement did not

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request Council approval for the multiyear contract.

(f) Council approval is necessary to authorize the multiyear agreement, the purchase orders issued under this contract, and to approve payment to Ohio for the regular unleaded gasoline provided between October 1, 2005 and June 23, 2006.

(g) The estimated total expenditure under this multiyear contract with Ohio is \$3,596,400.00.

(h) Council approval is necessary to allow the District to continue to receive the benefit of these vital goods and services from Ohio.

Sec. 3. The Council determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the District of Columbia Multiyear Contract for the Purchase of Fuel under Federal Contract No. SP0600-05-D-4058 Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Act of 2006 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to approve the negotiated compensation collective bargaining agreement, submitted by the Mayor for the Department of Mental Health between the Psychologists Union of the Department of Mental Health, Local 3758, 1199 National Union of Hospital and Health Care Employees, American Federation of State, County, and Municipal employees AFL-CIO and the Department of Mental Health Appendix Re-Opener for the fiscal year 2007.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Compensation Settlement for Employees Represented by the Psychologists Union of the Department of Mental Health, Local 3758, 1199 National Union of Hospital and Health Care Employees, American Federation of State, County, and Municipal employees AFL-CIO and the Department of Mental Health Appendix Re-Opener Emergency Approval Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2 (a) Pursuant to section 1717(j) of the District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act of 1978, effective March 3, 1979 (D.C. Law 2-139; D.C. Official Code § 1-618.17(j)) ("Act"), the Mayor submitted the compensation Collective Bargaining Agreement and pay schedules of the contract between the Department of Mental Health and the Psychologists Union of the District of Columbia Department of Mental Health, Local 3758, 1199 National Union of Hospital and Health Care Employees, American Federation of State, County, and Municipal employees AFL-CIO Appendix Re-Opener to include fiscal year 2007.

(b) In order for this to occur in accordance with the terms of the negotiated agreement, this must be authorized as quickly as possible. The Mayor recommended that it be approved on an emergency basis.

(c) Failure to expeditiously effectuate the express terms of the negotiated agreement may result in undermining the confidence of union members in the District of Columbia government and its leadership.

(d) Failure to act in an expedited manner may jeopardize the future relationship between labor and management in the District of Columbia and the success of collaborative efforts, as agreed upon under the terms of the negotiated agreement.

(e) The compensation system changes approved represent a compensation system for all psychologists, clinical interns, and clinical psychology residents employed by the Department of Mental Health, and in accordance with the memorandum dated June 21, 1993 between American Federation of State, County, Municipal Employees, Local 3758, 1199 and the Department of Mental Health, excludes management officials, confidential employees, supervisors, and any employee engaged in the administration of the provisions of Title 17 of the Act.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Compensation Settlement for Employees Represented by the Psychologists Union of the Department of Mental Health, Local 3758, 1199 National Union of Hospital and Health Care Employees, American Federation of State, County, and Municipal employees AFL-CIO and the Department of Mental Health Appendix Re-Opener Resolution of 2006 be adopted on an emergency basis.

Sec. 3. The compensation system changes approved in section 2 represent a compensation system for all dentists, physicians, and podiatrists employed by the District of Columbia Department of Corrections, the District of Columbia Department of Public Works, and the District of Columbia Department of Human Services, including all dentists, physicians and podiatrists who, prior to October 1, 1987, were employed by St. Elizabeths Hospital, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and pursuant to Public Law 98-621, as of October 1, 1987, became employed by the District of Columbia Department of Human Services, excluding management officials, supervisors, confidential employees, employees engaged in personnel work in other than purely clerical capacities, employees who are regularly scheduled for less than 40 hours per pay period, and employees engaged in the administration of the provisions of Title XVII of the Act.

Sec. 4. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Chief Financial Officer as the fiscal impact statement required by section 602(c)(3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(3)).

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to authorize the Chief Financial Officer to reallocate the commodities budget for fiscal year 2006.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Fiscal Year 2006 Year-End Commodities Budget Reallocation Authority Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2006".

Sec. 2. (a) There is a need to ensure that all funds allocated in the fiscal year 2006 budget for all consumption-driven commodities, including electricity, fuel, water, steam, natural gas, postage, telephone, custodial, security, occupancy, and rent are reallocated by the Chief Financial Officer to meet the requirements of Fire and Emergency Medical Services, Department of Health, Department of Human Services, and the Department of Mental Health.

(b) The proposed resolution authorizes the Chief Financial Officer to take the steps necessary to ensure that the fiscal year 2006 commodities budget is reallocated to meet the actual requirements of these agencies to ensure that the budget fiscal year 2006 commodities is balanced.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Fiscal Year 2006 Year-End Commodities Reallocation Authority Emergency Act of 2006 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately
