Councilmember Carol Schwartz, Chair of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment, and Councilmember David A. Catania, Chair of the Committee on Health, announce a Joint Public Oversight Hearing on the Ongoing Clean-up of Toxins From a 1990 Underground Gasoline Tank Leak across the Maryland Line from the Riggs Park Neighborhood in Northeast. The hearing will be held on Thursday, May 12, 2005, at 10:00 a.m. in the Council Chamber (Room 500) of the John Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue N.W., Washington, D.C. 20004.

In 1990, an underground tank at the Chevron gas station located at 5801 Riggs Road, in Chillum, MD, which is on the MD/DC line, sprung a leak. The leak was known to the State of Maryland's Department of the Environment, but it did not come to the attention of the District of Columbia until 2001. This hearing has been scheduled to afford the residents of Riggs Park an opportunity to air publicly their concerns about the investigation and clean-up of the gasoline spill. In addition, the Committees will seek answers from the District Department of Health and the United States Environmental Protection Agency with a goal of working to bring about a resolution to the problem.

The Committees extend an invitation to the public to testify at the joint hearing. Bill 16-179 proposes to amend the District of Columbia Campaign Finance Reform and Conflict of Interest Act to clarify the term "exploratory committee"; to distinguish between activities that would be classified as exploratory and campaign activities; to establish recording and accounting procedures for exploratory committees; to require exploratory committees to register with the Office of Campaign Finance and to list their officers; to require exploratory committees to file a disclosure report and a termination disclosure report; to prohibit contributions from particular classes of donors; to establish individual and aggregate contribution limits; and to limit the operational term of exploratory committees.
