Councilmember Phil Mendelson, Chairman of the Committee of the Judiciary, announces a public hearing on Bill 16-138, the "Electronic Recording Procedures and Penalties Act of 2005". The public hearing will be held at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, May 19, 2005 in the Council Chamber of the John A. Wilson Building.

The effect of Bill 16-138 would be to discipline (including terminate) officers of Metropolitan Police Department who fail to electronically record interrogations conducted in Metropolitan Police Department interview rooms, and to eliminate a rebuttable presumption that unrecorded interrogations are inadmissible in court.

The hearing, initially scheduled for May 18, 2005, is rescheduled due to a scheduling conflict.
