A reprogramming will become effective on the 15th day after official receipt unless a Member of the Council files a notice of disapproval of the request which extends the Council's review period to 30 days. If such notice is given, a reprogramming will become effective on the 31st day after its official receipt unless a resolution of approval or disapproval is adopted by the Council prior to that time.

Reprog. 16-18: Reprogramming \$3,000,000 of capital budget authority within the Office of the Chief Technology Officer from the Facility Improvements/SHARE Facility Upgrade project and the Information Technology Initiative-Document Management project to the Citywide Enterprise Resource Planning project was received in the Chairman's Office on April 28, 2005. The reprogramming will cover higher costs for the Administrative Services Modernization Program (ASMP).
