Councilmember Phil Mendelson, Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary, announces a public hearing on Bill 16-205, "Child Support Guideline Revision Act of 2005." The hearing will be held on Tuesday, July 5, 2005, at 10 a.m., in the 5<sup>th</sup> Floor Council Chamber of the John A. Wilson Building located at 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. This notice has been abbreviated to allow the Committee and public to consider Bill 16-205 and Bill 16-319 at the same time since both bills address the collection and disbursement of child support within the District of Columbia.

The stated purpose of the bill is to revise and update the child support guidelines to reflect the current cost of raising children, to address the circumstances presently affecting individuals paying and receiving child support, to specify the manner in which income may be verified for the purposes of calculating child support, and for other purposes.

The hearing notice has been revised to include the addition of Bill 16-319 to the hearing notice. The stated purpose of Bill 16-319 is to amend Title 16 of the District of Columbia Official Code to conform the garnishment provisions to the income withholding requirements applicable to child support orders, to require the Superior Court of the District of Columbia to order that certain support payments be made through the Collection and Disbursement Unit, and for other purposes.

The purpose of this hearing is to receive testimony from the public and government officials about the establishment of child support guidelines in the District of Columbia.
