Bill 17-760 which was introduced by Councilmember Schwartz would amend an Act authorizing the sale of certain real estate in the District of Columbia no longer required for public purposes, to require the Council to determine that public property is no longer needed for public purposes before and separate from any disposition proceedings. The bill establishes standards that require the Mayor to determine District needs first through consultation with agencies and then requires a community meeting prior to declaring property surplus.

Bill 17-527 which was introduced by Councilmember Thomas and Barry would amend an Act authorizing the sale of certain real estate in the District of Columbia no longer required for public purposes and The Master Facilities Planning and Program Coordination Advisory Act of 2003. The bill maintains the process to declare property as no longer needed for public purposes and the process to dispose of property as a single Council action and creates standards that must be met prior to classifying public property as surplus and a committee to set criteria for the surplusing of public property.
