Councilmember Phil Mendelson, Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary, announces a public oversight hearing on Police Service Area (PSA) boundaries and on Bill 16-241, the "District of Columbia Community Protection Act of 2005". The hearing will be held on Wednesday, October 5, 2005, at 11:00 a.m., in the 5<sup>th</sup> Floor Council Chamber located at 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

The purpose of the oversight hearing is to hear from the public and the government on the operations, management, and overall performance impact of the newly restructured PSA boundaries.

The stated purpose of Bill 16-241 is to establish, within the Metropolitan Police Department, the Division of Special Community Operations whose purpose would be to patrol the District's communities and any public event that attracts more than fifty individuals, to provide staffing requirements for the Division of Special Community Operations, to require the Metropolitan Police Department to conduct a study to determine the most appropriate assignment of officers, to require information to be submitted to the Council and for other purposes. The purpose of this hearing is to receive testimony from the government and the public on this bill.
