Notice of Reprogramming Request

Pursuant to DC Code Sec 47-361-et.seq of the Reprogramming Policy Act of 1990, the Council of the District of Columbia gives notice that the Mayor has transmitted the following reprogramming request(s).

A reprogramming will become effective on the 15th day after official receipt unless a Member of the Council files a notice of disapproval of the request which extends the Council's review period to 30 days. If such notice is given, a reprogramming will become effective on the 31st day after its official receipt unless a resolution of approval or disapproval is adopted by the Council prior to that time.

Reprog. 16-39: Request to reprogram \$2,025,564 of special purpose revenue budget authority from the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development, the Office of the Attorney General, and the Public Services Commission to the District of Columbia Public Schools was received in the Chairman's Office on July 25, 2005. The reprogramming will provide budget authority to pay for maintenance of certain facilities.

Reprog. 16-40: Request to reprogram \$600,000 of special purpose revenue budget authority from the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration to the Department of Human Services was received in the Chairman's Office on July 27, 2005. The reprogramming will provide interim cash assistance to low income disabled District residents.

Reprog. 16-41: Request to reprogram \$66,993 of special purpose revenue budget authority from the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration to the Department of Human Services was received in the Chairman's Office on July 27, 2005. Reprog. 16-42: Request to reprogram \$2,000,000 of local fund budget authority within the Department of Mental Health was received in the Chairman's Office on July 27, 2005. The reprogramming will pay for contractual services including maintenance and food services for persons with mental illness.

Reprog. 16-43: Request to reprogram \$19,045,722 of capital budget authority from five agencies to D.C. Public Schools was received in the Chairman's Office on July 27, 2005. The reprogramming will allow the District of Columbia Public Schools to purchase school buses currently leased.

Reprog. 16-44: Request to reprogram \$3,000,000 of capital budget authority from the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development to the Chief Technology Officer was received in the Chairman's Office on July 27, 2005. The reprogramming will allow the Chief Technology Officer to purchase wireless communications equipment for the Metropolitan Police and the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department.

Reprog. 16-45: Request to reprogram \$8,800,000 of local budget authority from the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department, the Metropolitan Police Department, and the Office of Administrative Hearings to the Department of Corrections was received in the Chairman's Office on July 27, 2005. The reprogramming will cover higher than anticipated personal services expenditures and contractual services costs related to inmate bedspace acquisition.
