Councilmember Vincent B. Orange, Sr., Chairperson of the Committee on Government Operations, announces a Public Hearing on Bill 16-254, the "Congress Heights Community Center Act of 2005". The Public Hearing will commence at 10:30 a.m., on Thursday, September 29, 2005, 5th Floor Council Chamber, John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

Bill 16-254 proposes to declare the property located at 1600 Alabama Avenue, S.E., Washington, D.C., to be no longer required for public purposes and directs the Mayor to transfer the property to be used for a community center to an entity to be formed by East of the River Development Corporation, Anacostia Economic Development Corporation, Ward 8 Business Council, and Far Southeast Collaborative.

Subject to compliance with section 2209 of the District of Columbia Reform Act of 1995, approved April 26, 1996 (110 Stat. 1321 [244]); D.C. Official Code §38-1802.09), the Mayor shall transfer, without consideration, fee simple title to any entity to be formed by East of the River Development Corporation, Anacostia Economic Development Corporation, Ward 8 Business Council, and Far Southeast Collaborative, subject to the following terms and conditions: (1) The transferee shall cause to be developed a community service center that will accommodate not-for-profit community groups with activities open to, and for the good of, all residents; (2) The transferee and any developer of the Project selected by transferee shall execute an LSDBE MOU and First Source Agreement; (3) The Project shall be completed in not less than 10 years; and

(4) If the terms and conditions shall not be met at any time, the Property, along with any improvements thereon, shall revert to the District.
