**Councilmember Carol Schwartz, Chair of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment, announces a Public Hearing on Bill 16-188, the "Pedestrian Protection Bus Safety Amendment Act of 2005," Bill 16-206, the "Scrap Vehicle Title Authorization Act of 2005," and Bill 16-232, the "Illegal Dumping Enforcement Amendment Act of 2005." Bill 16-188 was introduced by Councilmember Catania and would amend the Pedestrian Protection Amendment Act of 1987 to prohibit the driver of a vehicle from passing any bus receiving or discharging passengers at an intersection to make a right turn. **This portion of the hearing will run from 11:45 a.m. until 12:30 p.m.**

Bill 16-206 was introduced by Chairman Cropp at the request of the Mayor and would provide for the issuance of a scrap vehicle title permitting companies that are storing unclaimed vehicles that were in an accident, stolen or are otherwise deemed abandoned to use or sell the vehicle for parts, and to make conforming amendments. **This portion of the hearing will run from 12:30 p.m. until 1:15 p.m.**

Bill 16-232 was introduced by Councilmember Brown and co-sponsored by Chairman Cropp and Councilmembers Barry, Orange, Schwartz, Fenty, Gray, Ambrose, Mendelson, Evans and Graham. The purpose of the bill is to amend the Illegal Dumping Enforcement Act of 1994 to increase the fines for the disposing of solid waste, hazardous

waste, or medical waste on any public or private area in the District of Columbia. **This portion of the hearing will run from 1:15 until 2:00 p.m.**

Bill 16-147 was introduced by Councilmember Mendelson and would provide clear rules for a perpetual real estate interest, called an environmental covenant, in order to regulate the use of brownfields when real estate is transferred from one owner to another, and for other purposes.

In her role as Chair of the Committee, Chair Schwartz wrote the District of Columbia Auditor on April 29, 2004 asking for a review of the Subsidy's expenses. The results of that audit were presented to the Committee at the end of the FY 2006 budget cycle.

Councilmember Jim Graham, Chairperson of the Committee on Consumer and Regulatory Affairs, will re-convene a recessed public roundtable on B16-80, "Prostitution-Related Nuisance Abatement Amendment Act of 2005," originally held on June 8, 2005, and include consideration of B16-396, the "Administrative Search of Drug-Related Properties Amendment Act of 2005"; and B16-397, the "Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs Nuisance Property and Cease and Desist Clarification Amendment Act of 2005". **This notice is being revised to include relevant, recently introduced legislation.**

B16-396 would authorize the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs to apply, based on certain standards and procedures, directly to a judge for a search warrant to conduct any inspection required or authorized by law. B16-397 would require that a copy of a cease and desist order issued on a holder of certain business or professional license also be served on the holder of a certificate of occupancy for the premises and the property owner of record, where those persons or entities are separate and distinct from the licensee. Furthermore, B16-397 would excise the role of the Office of the United States Attorney in abating drug-related nuisance properties, strengthening the District's role in local abatement.
