Councilmember Phil Mendelson, Chairman of the Committee of the Judiciary, announces a public hearing on Titles IV and V on Bill 16-283, the "Health Care Reform Act of 2005", and Titles III, IV, and V on Bill 16-418, the "Medical Malpractice Reform Act of 2005". The public hearing will be held on Thursday, December 1, 2005 at 11:00 a.m., in the 5th Floor Council Chamber of the John A. Wilson Building.

The stated purpose of Titles IV and V on Bill 16-283 is to require a certificate of merit in medical liability actions and establish limits on compensation for non-economic damages in medical liability claims. The stated purpose of Titles III, IV, and V on Bill 16-418 is to require that individuals file a notice of intent to sue 90-days prior to filing suit, to mandate mediation by the parties early in the litigation, and to make certain benevolent gestures inadmissible.

Testimony should be limited to the specified titles.

The first portion of the hearing will be limited to presentations by selected stakeholders. Following questions by the Committee members, additional testimony will be permitted. The Committee expects that there may be numerous witnesses and witnesses should be prepared to limit their testimony to three minutes.
