The District of Columbia Construction Codes of 2008

(Comments Received though July 9, 2008)

Councilmember Mary M. Cheh, Chairperson of the Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs, is accepting comments on proposed amendments to the District of Columbia Construction Codes. The "Construction Codes Amendment Resolution of 2008" is now before the Committee. This resolution would approve amendments to Title 12 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, replacing the existing Title 12 Construction Code Supplement of 2003, with a new Title 12, Construction Code Supplement of 2008. Comments will be received until noon on Wednesday, July 9th, 2008.

Pursuant to Section 10 of the Construction Codes Approval and Amendments Act of 1986, effective March 21, 1987 (D.C. Law 6-216; D.C. Official Code, § 6-1409), all proposed amendments to the Construction Codes must be submitted to the Council for a 45-day period of review.

The Committee invites the public to submit written comments, which will be made a part of the official record. All comments should be submitted to the Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs, Room 108 of the John A. Pursuant to Rules of Organization and Procedure for the Council of the District of Columbia Council Period 17, Section 601, notice is given by the Secretary to the Council, Cynthia Brock-Smith, that the Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs filed on June 24, 2008, in the Office of the Secretary, a resolution authorizing an investigation by the Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs to authorize an investigation into the accumulation of surplus, refusal to acknowledge a legal obligation to promote public health, rate-setting, executive compensation, community benefits, and financial relationships of Group Hospitalization and Medical Services, Inc. and CareFirst, Inc. The text of the resolution is herein.

A RESOLUTION

IN THE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SERVICES AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS OF
THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To authorize an investigation by the Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs into the accumulation of surplus, refusal to acknowledge a legal obligation to promote public health, rate-setting, executive compensation, community benefits, and financial relationships of Group Hospitalization and Medical Services, Inc. and CareFirst, Inc.

RESOLVED, BY THE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SERVICES AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS, That this resolution may be cited as the "Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs CareFirst Investigation Authorization Resolution of 2008".

Sec. 2. The Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs finds that the circumstances surrounding the compliance of Group Hospitalization and Medical Services, Inc., d/b/a CareFirst BlueCross BlueShield ("GHMSI") and its parent company, CareFirst, Inc., with GHMSI's non-profit corporate charter warrant the conduct of an investigation. For the purpose of this investigation, the Chairperson of the Committee is authorized to issue subpoenas to compel a witness's attendance, to obtain testimony, and to produce documents, evidence, other information, or tangible items, pursuant to the authority provided in section 413 of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 789; D.C. Code § 1-204.13), and section 601(b) of the Rules

of Organization and Procedure for the Council of the District of Columbia, Council Period XVII.

Sec. 3. This investigation will examine:

- (1) GHMSI's accumulation of more than \$745 million in surplus funds and the purpose of that accumulation;
- (2) GHMSI's refusal to acknowledge its legal obligation to promote public health;
- (3) GHMSI's policies and practices for setting rates;
- (4) GHMSI's policies and practices for executive compensation, including its contribution to the nearly \$18 million compensation package for former CareFirst CEO William Jews;
- (5) GHMSI's policies and practices for community benefits, including its contribution to the Open Enrollment program;
- (6) the financial relationships of GHMSI to its parent company and subsidiaries;
- (7) CareFirst, Inc.'s control and influence over GHMSI's actions in the matters listed above; and
- (8) all relevant facts and circumstances related to the matters listed above to determine what, if any, legislative action may be appropriate.

Sec. 4. The Committee Clerk of the Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs shall file this resolution, upon its adoption, in the Office of the Secretary, in accordance with section 601(b) of the Rules of Organization and Procedure for the Council of the District of Columbia, Council Period XVII.

Sec. 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
