On Friday, July 11, 2008, Councilmember Graham will hold a public hearing on Bill 17-799, the "Ward 2 Targeted Single Sales Moratorium Act of 2008"; Bill 19-797, the "Ward 6 Single Sales Moratorium Amendment Act of 2008"; and Bill 17-846, the "Mt. Pleasant Anti-Sale of Single Containers of Alcoholic Beverages Amendment Act of 2008". The public hearing will be held beginning at 10 am in Room 123 of the historic John A. Wilson Building. **This notice is being abbreviated in order to provide timely notice to the public.**

Bill 17-799 would proscribe the sales of single containers of beer, malt liquor, or ale by off-premises retailers located in Advisory Neighbourhood Commissions 2C and 2F of Ward 2.

Bill 19-797 would prohibit the sale of single containers of beer, malt liquor or ale by off-premises retailers located in Ward 6.

Bill 17-846 would prohibit the sale of single containers of alcoholic beverages by off-premises retailers located in Mt. Pleasant (ANC-1D), in Ward 1.

The Committee invites the public to testify or to submit written testimony, which will be made a part of the official record. Those who wish to testify should contact Mr. Marcus Goodwin at (202) 724-8195 before 5 p.m. on Thursday, July 10, 2008. Witnesses should bring 16 copies of their testimony to the hearing. Individuals will be permitted 3 minutes for oral presentation; individuals representing organizations or groups, 5 minutes.

The stated purpose of Bill 17-325 is: to prohibit the use, sale, storage, and display of fireworks in the District of Columbia except in certain instances; to provide for civil penalties for possession or sale of fireworks; and to provide for civil penalties for possession or sale of fireworks.
