**Comprehensive HIV Prevention and Care Intervention Services Grants: Supporting local qualified applicants to develop to provide culturally appropriate, science-based programs with evidence based effectiveness, and which target persons at risk for infection, re-infection and/or transmission of HIV and support persons living with HIV for continuity of care services in all eight wards of the District of Columbia.**

The Government of the District of Columbia, Department of Health HIV/AIDS Administration (HAA) is soliciting applications from local qualified applicants to provide culturally appropriate, science-based programs with evidence based effectiveness, and which target persons at risk for infection, re-infection and/or transmission of HIV and support persons living with HIV for continuity of care services in all eight wards of the District of Columbia.

Specific program areas and target populations will be delineated in the RFA. In addition, approximately \$2,000,000 will be available in CDC-based funding to support the HIV prevention interventions as prioritized by the HPCPG, for programs anticipated to start January 1, 2009. Actual awards will be contingent on funding availability. **It is anticipated that this will be the sole RFA released by HAA for prevention programs for FY2009.**

**Effi Barry HIV/AIDS Program: Supporting local indigenous organizations to increase capacity to provide HIV-related prevention, care, and support services**

The Government of the District of Columbia, Department of Health HIV/AIDS Administration (HAA), in collaboration with the Office of Partnerships and Grants Development (OPGD) is soliciting applications from small (program budgets less than \$500,000) ward-based organizations to participate in the Effi Barry HIV/AIDS Program. The Effi Barry Program is a two-year training and capacity-building initiative that seeks to strengthen the internal administration and build the capacity of small community and faith-based organizations based and located within areas of the District hardest hit by the HIV/AIDS epidemic to start and/or expand a range of HIV/AIDS prevention and support programming. HAA encourages applicants that have HIV/AIDS as their primary mission and also those that seek to mainstream HIV activities into non-HIV/AIDS primary missions.

In accordance with the requirements of the Fiscal Year 2009 Budget Support Act of 2008, approximately \$700,000 in FY 08 District Appropriated funds will be utilized to support capacity-building grants under the Effi Barry Program. An additional \$650,000 is provided to the OPGD for the training and consultation services to the participants. The grant program shall be administered by HAA, with funding levels contingent upon availability of funds. Year-One mini-grants will support training participation and capacity-building interventions. Year-Two grants will support advanced organizational development and a selection of program service activities.

Funds will be awarded, as \$10,000 mini-grants for up to 20 new organizations (Year-One applicants did not receive prior mini-grants) and \$50,000 grants for approximately 10 continuing organizations (Year-Two organizations are those that participated in the FY08 Effi Barry Program and successfully completed the associated OPGD training course). Key trainings and technical assistance will also be provided to support successful new (Year-One) applicants and all continuing (Year-Two) organizations.

**2008 Housing and Housing Services for Persons Living with HIV/AIDS Grant**

**Notice Seeking Comments Regarding Reappointment of Administrative Law Judges**

The Commission on Selection and Tenure of Administrative Law Judges (Commission) Seeks Comments Regarding the Potential Reappointment of Administrative Law Judges Samuel McClendon, Elizabeth Figueroa and Erika Pierson.

This is to notify members of the bar and the general public, pursuant to section 3705.7 of Title 6 of the DCMR, that the Commission has begun review of the qualifications for reappointment of Administrative Law Judges McClendon, Figueroa and Pierson of the District of Columbia Office of Administrative Hearings. Administrative Law Judge McClendon has filed a statement with the Commission requesting reappointment to a six-year term upon the expiration of his initial two-year term on November 27, 2008. Administrative Law Judges Figueroa and Pierson have filed statements with the Commission requesting reappointment to six-year terms upon the expiration of their initial two-year terms on December 11, 2008.

Section 3705.21 of Title 6 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR) provides:

In deciding whether to reappoint an Administrative Law Judge, the Commission shall consider all information it has received concerning the reappointment, and the voting members shall give significant weight to the recommendation of the Chief Administrative Law Judge, unless they determine that the recommendation is not founded on substantial evidence. The Commission shall reappoint the Administrative Law Judge if it finds that the Administrative Law Judge has satisfactorily performed the responsibilities of his or her office and is likely to continue to do so.

In addition to the specific qualifications applicable to all Administrative Law Judges contained in section 3703 of Title 6 of the DCMR (*Appointment, Reappointment, Discipline, and Removal of Administrative Law Judges by the Commission on Selection and Tenure of Administrative Law Judges*), section 3703.5 of Title 6 of the DCMR states that “[a]n Administrative Law Judge shall possess judicial temperament, judgment, expertise, experience and analytical and other skills necessary and desirable for an Administrative Law Judge.”

The Commission hereby requests members of the bar and other attorneys, litigants, interested organizations, and members of the public to submit any information bearing on the qualifications of Administrative Law Judges McClendon, Figueroa and Pierson which it believes will aid the Commission in deciding whether to reappoint these Administrative

Law Judges. The cooperation of the community at an early stage will greatly aid the Commission in fulfilling its responsibilities. The identity of any person submitting information shall be kept confidential unless expressly authorized by the person submitting the information.
