Notice of Reprogramming Disapproval

Chairman Gray and Councilmember Barry filed on July 3, 2008, PR 17-931 the "Reprogramming No. 17-117 Disapproval Resolution of 2008" to disapprove Reprogramming 17-117. The request to reprogram \$2,150,000 of FY 2009 Special Purposes Revenue funds budget authority within the District Department of Transportation (DDOT) was filed in the Chairman's Office on June 19, 2008. The reprogramming will provide needed budget authority to purchase parking meters, provide additional funding for a rights-of-way project for sidewalks, and purchase pre-fabricated signs to enhance traffic calming.

The approval resolution extends the Council's review period to Saturday, July 19, 2008. If the Council does not adopt a resolution of approval or disapproval during this period, the reprogramming will be deemed approved on Sunday, July 20, 2008.

Reprog. 17-121: Request to reprogram \$10,800,000 of local funds budget authority from Repayment of Loans and Interest to the Department of Employment Services (DOES) was filed in the Chairman's Office on July 2, 2008. This reprogramming will ensure that DOES meets its wage and benefit obligations associated with payroll for more than 20,000 registered for the District's Summer Youth Employment program, and higher-than-anticipated hourly wage rates.
