Chairman Linda W. Cropp announces the scheduling of a public oversight hearing, by the Committee of the Whole, on the District of Columbia's Capital Improvements Program. The public oversight hearing originally scheduled for Tuesday, December 9, 2004, at 10:00 a.m., will be held instead on Wednesday, December 15, 2004, at 10:00 a.m., in the Council Chamber, Room 500 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

The purpose of the oversight hearing is to review and analyze District agencies' performance with their capital improvement projects through fiscal year 2004. At the oversight hearing, the Committee of the Whole will hear testimony from representatives from the Office of the Chief Financial Officer, as well as from representatives from District agencies.

Councilmembers Harold Brazil and Adrian Fenty, co-chairpersons of the Special Committee on a Comprehensive Housing Policy for the District of Columbia, announce a Public Roundtable on PR 15-1136, "Comprehensive Housing Strategy Task Force Neil O. Albert Confirmation Resolution of 2004" and PR 15-1137, "Comprehensive Housing Strategy Task Force Anthony C. Freeman Confirmation Resolution of 2004". The Public Roundtable will be held on Monday, December 13, 2004, at 1:00 p.m., in Room 123, at the John Wilson Building, located at 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

PRs 15-1136 and 15-1137 would confirm the appointments of the above-named individuals, respectively, as members of the Comprehensive Housing Strategy Task Force, established by the "Comprehensive Housing Strategy Act of 2003", effective March 10 2004 (D.C. Law 15-73). Nominee Neil O. Albert will complete the unexpired term of Lori E. Parker, and will continue to represent the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Children, Youth, Families and Elders on the Task Force. Nominee Anthony C. Freeman will complete the unexpired term of Theodore N. Carter, and will continue to represent the National Capital Revitalization Corporation on the Task Force. Each respective term will end June 15, 2005. The appointments of Ms. Parker and Mr. Carter had been approved initially by the Council on May 4, 2004.

The purpose of the Task Force is to "assess the quality and availability of housing for households of all income levels in the District of Columbia and to develop a set of public policy recommendations to address the housing needs of both current residents and the 100,000 new residents who are targeted to reside in the city over the next decade." The Task Force is

composed of 28 members who represent a variety of sectors with an interest in the provision of housing for current and future District residents, including District government agencies, private businesses and non-profit associations.

The purpose of this Public Roundtable is to receive testimony from the government and the public on the proposed resolutions. Persons who wish to present oral testimony at the Public Roundtable should, if possible, provide the following, by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, December 9, 2004, or at the Public Roundtable, to Peter Szegedy-Maszak, Counsel to the Special Committee on a Comprehensive Housing Policy for the District of Columbia, at 202-727-1234: their names, addresses, telephone numbers, and the name of the organization they represent (if any). Each person presenting oral testimony will be limited to 3 minutes and should provide the Special Committee with 25 written copies of his or her testimony prior to, or at, the Public Roundtable.
