Council Chairman Linda W. Cropp announces a public hearing by the Committee of the Whole on Bill 15-1132, the "Closing, Dedication, and Designation of Public Streets and Alleys in Squares 5246, 5272, 5273, 5276, 5277, 5279, 5280, and 5280, S.O. 04-0858, Act of 2004." The public hearing is scheduled for Thursday, December 16, 2004, at 11:00 a.m., in the Council Chamber, Room 500 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

Bill 15-1132, introduced by Councilmember Kevin Chavous, would: close Blaine Street NE between 58th Street NE and East Capitol Street; close 58th Place NE, 59th Street NE, 59th Place NE, and 60th Place NE, between Blaine Street NE and East Capitol Street; close 57th Street SE between A Street SE and East Capitol Street; close 57th Place SE between A Street SE and 57th Street SE; close certain existing alleys; and create new streets and alleys to be dedicated to the District, in Ward 7. These proposed street and alley closings, dedications and designations would facilitate the development by the District of Columbia Housing Authority and A&R/THC, LLC, of a mixed use project consisting of 515 residential units, a community building with a day care center, and a new shopping center with a supermarket.

PR 15-1194 would declare the sense of the Council with respect to the need to amend the Zoning Regulations to adopt a mandatory inclusionary zoning policy that requires new and rehabilitated residential developments to include housing units affordable to low and moderate income residents in exchange for permitting housing developers to obtain additional zoning density or other compensation as a matter of right.
