NOTICE OF PUBLIC INTERESTCERTIFICATION OF WINNER OF THE ELECTION
TO SERVE AS THE ACTIVE MEMBER OF THE
FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

The District of Columbia Retirement Reform Act (Pub. L. 96-122), effective November 17, 1979, at section 121(b)(2), (D.C. Official Code § 1-711(b)(2)) requires the District of Columbia Retirement Board ("Board") to conduct an election for one active member or officer of the Fire Department of the District of Columbia, among others, to be elected by the active members and officers of the Fire Department (D.C. Official Code § 1-711(b)(1)(A)(iii)). In accordance with the Rules of Election of Members of the D.C. Retirement Board as promulgated by the Board, 30 DCR 4333-4345, as amended ("Election Rules"), the Board, through the American Arbitration Association (AAA) conducted the required election for a full term on the Board commencing January 28, 2005.

At the designated time and place for submission of the required statements of candidacy, the AAA received only one candidate nomination. The statement of candidacy was valid and the nominee was determined to be an eligible candidate.

As named fiduciaries to the participants and beneficiaries of the Police Officers and Fire Fighters' Retirement Fund, the Board is subject to certain affirmative duties including an implied obligation to defray reasonable costs of plan administration. Accordingly, at its meeting on October 21, 2004 the Board determined that the cost of conducting full balloting for this election would not be a prudent expenditure given that the balloting could have only one valid outcome under the relevant provisions of the Election Rules. Since the only possible election winner could be the one nominated and eligible candidate, the Board voted unanimously at its meeting on October 21, 2004, to certify the results of the election and declare the winner to be Brian K. Lee.

Pursuant to section 408.4 of the Election Rules, any qualified candidate for the election may petition the Board in writing for a recount of votes within seven (7) calendar days of the date of publication of the certification of the winner. The petition must be filed at the Board's executive office located at 1400 L Street, N.W., Suite 300, Washington, D.C. 20005. In the absence of a request for a recount, the election results will become final and not subject to further appeal thirty (30) days after this official certification by the Board.
