GENERAL INFORMATION

INTRODUCTION

The Department of Human Services (DHS), Office of Early Childhood Development (OECD) is the lead agency in the District of Columbia responsible for providing child care services for District of Columbia children six (6) weeks through twelve (12) years of age. Additionally, OECD provides services to families that cannot afford quality child care at market prices, and that need child care at non-traditional hours, such as early mornings, overnight, weekends, and holidays.

The District of Columbia Mayor's Advisory Committee on Early Childhood Development (MACECD) has an Early Learning Opportunities Act Grant to establish the Early Readers Now Program, in Wards 1, 7 and 8 of the District of Columbia. The goal of the proposed program is to enhance early childhood development and literacy among children from birth through age four years by training, supporting, and linking parents, relative caregivers, child care providers/educators, faith-based providers, librarians, and volunteers from community-based organizations to implement literacy programs to meet the school-readiness needs of young children. MACECD is currently providing training programs, on-site technical assistance, and reading clubs for families to prompt child care providers, librarians, parents, and existing literacy programs to facilitate early learning among children from birth through age four years in the five target wards. MACECD is also undertaking a social marketing and public awareness campaign, in partnership with the Executive Office of the Mayor, Serve DC, to increase awareness about the importance of early childhood literacy and school readiness and enhance links between families and resources to support literacy.

Information about MACECD's Early Learning Opportunity Act Sub-grants, program expectations, and all other details are contained in this RFA. The Review Panel is an independent entity which shall consist of representatives with prior experience judging grant applicants.

ELIGIBLE ORGANIZATIONS/ENTITIES

Program Area 1: DHS/OECD seeks applicants who have demonstrated experience in evaluation in early childhood initiatives, including the establishment of research-based indicators for program effectiveness. The applicant must provide a list of references and/or recent clients. A familiarity with the goals, framework and research and evaluation design of the Kellogg Foundation SPARK initiative is also preferred.

Program Area 2: DHS/OECD seeks applicants from non-profit organizations with documented and successful track record of working with parents/guardians and/or

families in an already established literacy outreach program in low income neighborhoods.

Program Area 3: DHS/OECD seeks applications from non-profit organizations that have: 1. documentation of previously established relationships and contacts with a diverse faith-based community, 2. proven communication methods with these contacts, and 3. letters of support from faith based entities demonstrating their willingness to participate in this project.

Program Area 4: DHS/OECD seeks applications that have documentation of a strong background in nonprofit web and database design. Applicant must illustrate a strong familiarity with the workings of volunteer service organizations with an emphasis on literacy.

Sections 1351 through 1353 of the District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act of 1978 (CMPA), effective March 3, 1979 (D.C. Law 2-139; D.C. Official Code § 1-613.51 *et seq.*) (2001), established a comprehensive performance management system for the District government. Chapter 14 of the *D.C. Personnel Regulations*, Performance Management, implements the guidelines and procedures for the Performance Management Program pursuant to sections 1351 through 1353 of the CMPA.

The majority of non-unionized, non-managerial and non-supervisory Career Service employees in agencies under the personnel authority of the Mayor are not currently covered under the Performance Management Program. However, section 1400.1 (e) of Chapter 14 of the regulations provides that the Director of Personnel may, on an agency-by-agency basis, authorize coverage under the Performance Management Program for this category of employees.

Further, section 1400.2 of the regulations provides that, upon authorizing an agency for coverage pursuant to section 1400.1 (e) of the regulations, the Director of Personnel shall publish such authorization in the *D.C. Register*.

NOTICE REGARDING ELECTRONIC FILING REQUIREMENTS

**Requirement to File Certain Quarterly Corporation Franchise and Unincorporated
Franchise Estimated Tax Returns and
To Make Corporation Franchise and Unincorporated Franchise Estimated Tax Payments
Electronically**

This notice corrects the notice published in the D.C. Register dated October 22, 2004 pertaining to Electronic Filing of Corporation Franchise and Unincorporated Franchise returns and payments. Please disregard that notice.

Pursuant to Section 47-4402(c) of the D.C. Official Code, the Office of Tax and Revenue (OTR) has published regulations that require certain business taxpayers to file and pay taxes electronically if the amount of the payment due for a tax period exceeds \$25,000. See *DC Register*, April 11, 2003. The District has set a goal to increase the amount of electronic filing and payment of taxes. This effort commenced with monthly Employer Withholding tax returns due for June 2003, followed by Sales and Use Tax returns due March 20, 2004. Beginning with Corporation Franchise returns due March 15, 2005 and Unincorporated Franchise returns due April 15, 2005, electronic filing and payment will be required for all taxpayers filing *quarterly Corporation Franchise and Unincorporated Franchise estimated tax returns*, where the payment due for a filing period exceeds \$25,000. This requirement applies to those business taxpayers, whether located in the District or outside the District.

OTR will identify current taxpayers that meet the criteria to file and pay electronically: i.e. business taxpayers of Corporation Franchise tax and Unincorporated Franchise tax returns whose quarterly estimated tax liability regularly exceeds \$25,000. These designated taxpayers will be sent a letter to notify them of the electronic filing requirement. The OTR Letter will include the steps to be followed by the taxpayer (or the taxpayer's representative) to register for electronic filing and payment of Corporation and Unincorporated Franchise estimated taxes. Within 30 days of the due date of the first quarterly filing, those designated taxpayers will be asked to begin making their estimated tax payments by one of two methods: ACH Credit or ACH debit.

ACH Credit payments must be transmitted in accordance with specifications contained in the "ACH Credit Guide" posted at http://www.taxpayerservicecenter.com/ACHCredit_Information.pdf. Taxpayers who choose to pay their Corporation Franchise or Unincorporated Franchise estimated taxes by **ACH Debit** should first register for Electronic Taxpayer Service Center (eTSC) access with OTR by mailing or faxing the eTSC registration form that can be downloaded from <http://www.taxpayerservicecenter.com/GetStarted.jsp>. After eTSC registration, a *User ID* and *Password* will allow taxpayers 24-hour access to the eTSC web site to view their accounts.

The regulations also establish penalties for the failure to file and pay electronically. These penalties will apply where the taxpayer has been notified in writing to comply with the new electronic filing requirement and has failed to do so. See 9 DCMR 105.

On September 29, 2004, the Office of Zoning received an application from The Catholic University (the "applicant") for approval of an amendment to and further processing of an approved campus plan and a map amendment from unzoned to R-5-A for Parcel 121/29 in Square 3663.

The property that is the subject of this application consists of Square 3654, Lots 3-6, 10, 12, 15-17, 801-806, 809-811; Square 3655, Lot 1; Square 3656, Lot 800; Square 3657, Lots 805, 821, 826; Square 3663, Parcel 121/29; Square 3671, Lots 23, 3, 802; and Square 3821, Lots 45, 45, 817, and Parcels 122/5, 122/5, 122/71, in Ward 5. The majority of the campus is zoned R-5-A.

The applicant seeks an amendment to and further processing of the campus plan in order to include the West Campus within its boundaries and make viable use of the newly acquired parcel. The map amendment for Parcel 121/29 is necessary to establish the R-5-A zoning to allow its inclusion within the campus plan. This request is not inconsistent with the Comprehensive Plan of the District of Columbia.
