Councilmember Carol Schwartz, Chair of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment, announces a Public Roundtable on Bill 15-981, the "Distracted Driving Safety Revised Amendment Act of 2004," Bill 15-1011, the "Department of Motor Vehicles Reform Amendment Act of 2004," and "PR 15-1032, the "Special Use Identification Tag Approval Resolution of 2004." This Roundtable has been scheduled to discuss the following:

Bill 15-981, the "Distracted Driving Safety Revised Amendment Act of 2004," introduced by Councilmember Schwartz, would amend the Distracted Driving Safety Act of 2004 to clarify that no points shall be assessed for a violation of the Act that does not contribute to an accident;

Bill 15-1011, the "Department of Motor Vehicles Reform Amendment Act of 2004," introduced by Chairman Cropp at the request of the Mayor, would implement a number of changes to the operations of the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV).

Among the more important changes proposed by the bill would be to allow the DMV Director to synchronize inspection and registration expiration dates, to establish new notice requirements for damaged motor vehicles, to simplify the disabled parking tag and placard application process, to establish a discretionary drug testing program for DMV employees suspected of drug use, to create vehicle excise tax exemption categories for widowers, widows and divorcees and to allow residents to register their company cars even if owned by out-of state companies; and

PR 15-1032, the "Special Use Identification Tag Approval Resolution of 2004," introduced by Chairman Cropp at the request of the Mayor, would amend existing rules in Title 18, DCMR (Traffic Regulations) pertaining to the activities of car dealers. It would provide for a continued prohibition on the issuance of special use identification tags ("temporary tags") by used car dealers, limit the persons eligible to receive temporary tags from the DMV Director, limit the total number of dealer identification tags and dealer transport tags that may be issued to a dealership, clarify title transfer procedures and establish additional reporting requirements related to temporary tags.

Councilmembers Harold Brazil and Adrian Fenty, co-chairpersons of the Special Committee on a Comprehensive Housing Policy for the District of Columbia (“Special Committee”), announce a public roundtable on the progress of the Comprehensive Housing Strategy Task Force, established under the “Comprehensive Housing Strategy Act of 2003”.(D.C.Law 15-73). The Special Committee was established under the “Establishment of the Special Committee on a Comprehensive Housing Policy for the District of Columbia Resolution of 2003” (Res. 15-89) . The public roundtable will be held from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 3, 2004, in the Council Chamber (Room 500), 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W. (John A. Wilson Building), Washington, DC 20004.

The Act authorizes the Comprehensive Housing Strategy Task Force to assess the quality and availability of housing for households at all income levels in the District of Columbia and to develop a set of public policy recommendations to address the housing needs of both current residents and the 100,000 new residents that are expected to move into the District over the next ten 10 years. The Task Force is comprised of twenty-eight (28) members, whose Mayoral appointments were approved by the Council of the District of Columbia on May 4, 2004. They represent the public, private and non-profit housing sectors and interests of the District of Columbia real estate community. Under the Act, the Task Force should present its Comprehensive Housing Strategy to the Council and the Mayor within one year from its appointment, namely by May 4, 2005.

The Resolution authorizes the Special Committee to oversee the progress of the Task Force in developing a comprehensive housing strategy for the District of Columbia. Because the Task Force has already held two (2) meetings and has recently formed committees to address specific housing policy issues, the Special Committee is requesting an update from the Task Force regarding its progress to date and its future plans regarding the development of a comprehensive housing strategy. The Special Committee is conducting this public roundtable also to receive testimony from the government and the public on the progress and operation of the Task Force.
