SUBJECT: Establishment-Comprehensive Plan Update Task Force

ORIGINATING AGENCY: Office of the Mayor

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(2) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, as amended, Pub. L. No. 93-198, 87 Stat. 790, D.C. Official Code §1-204.22(2), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

I. ESTABLISHMENT

There is hereby established in the Executive Branch of the Government of the District of Columbia a Comprehensive Plan Update Task Force (hereinafter referred to as "Task Force").

II. PURPOSE

The Task Force shall advise on and guide the update of the District of Columbia Comprehensive Plan (hereinafter referred to as the "Plan").

III. FUNCTIONS

The Task Force shall work with the Office of Planning to:

- a. Review and discuss proposed policies, concepts, recommendations, action items and strategies as they are developed.
- b. Ensure that public outreach and participation is an integral and important part of the update process.
- c. Provide input into the development of the Plan update document and Land Use Map.
- d. Review the Administrative Draft of the Plan update.

IV. COMPOSITION

- a. The Council shall be comprised of twenty-seven (27) voting members, appointed by the Mayor.

- b. Of the twenty-seven (27) members appointed, the Mayor shall appoint fourteen (14) members of the Task Force based on nominations submitted by members of the Council of the District of Columbia.
- c. Members of the Task Force shall be residents of the District, or shall represent a business, social service organization, educational institution, or other organization located in the District.
- d. Members of the Task Force shall be comprised of a diverse group representing community, business, educational, faith, social service and other stakeholders.
- e. Any member who fails to attend three (3) unexcused, consecutive meetings shall be deemed to be removed from the Task Force and a vacancy created.
- g. The Mayor shall appoint members to fill vacancies in an unexpired term only for the remainder of the unexpired time of the term.

V. TERMS

The Task Force members shall serve, at the pleasure of the Mayor, until March 31, 2006. In the event of a vacancy, a new member may be appointed to fill an unexpired term and shall serve for the remainder of that term, or until March 31, 2006.

VI. COMPENSATION

Members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation, except that a member may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the authorized execution of official Task Force duties, if approved in advance by the Director, Office of Planning.

VII. ORGANIZATION

- a. The Mayor shall appoint a Chairperson and a Vice Chairperson from among the appointed members of the Task Force. The Chairperson and Vice Chairperson shall serve in those capacities at the pleasure of the Mayor.
- b. The Task Force may establish subcommittees as needed. Subcommittees may include persons who are not members of the full Task Force, provided that each subcommittee is chaired by a Task Force member and includes a majority of Task Force members.

- c. Members appointed by the Mayor may designate in writing alternate members to attend meetings on their behalf, but the alternate members shall not be permitted to vote on matters coming before the Task Force.
- d. The Chairperson may excuse members for emergency circumstances. All excuses shall be noted by the chairperson in the written record prior to each meeting of the Task Force.
- e. The Task Force may establish its own bylaws and rules of procedure, subject to the approval of the Mayor or his designee.
- f. There shall be no voting by proxy by members of the Task Force.

VIII. ADMINISTRATION


The Office of Planning shall provide administrative and staff support to the Task Force.

IX. SUNSET

The Task Force shall sunset on March 31, 2006.






SUBJECT: Designation of Special Event Area

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(11) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22(11) (2001), and pursuant to 19 DCMR § 1301.8 (June 2001), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. Commencing September 25, 2004 through September 26, 2004, daily from 6:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m., the streets known as "E" Street, N.W., and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., between 13th and 14th Streets, N.W., adjacent to Freedom Plaza, together with Freedom Plaza itself, are designated as a special event area to be used as a vending marketplace and cultural festival site.
2. The Royal Thai Embassy is authorized to operate the cultural event and vending marketplace described above in the designated special event area at the times specified.



No. 108-7 and Mayor's Order 88-194, dated August 23, 1998, it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. **WILLIAM O. HOWLAND**, Acting Director, Department of Public Works, is appointed Chairperson of the One Fund Executive Committee, and is delegated the authority to approve the acceptance and use of gifts or donations for the operation and administration of the 50th D.C. 





Official Code § 1-204.22 (6) (2001) and pursuant to the Emergency and Non-Emergency Number Telephone Calling Systems Fund Act of 2000 (the "Act"), effective October 1, 2000, (D.C. Law 13-172, D.C. Official Code § 34-1801 *et seq.* (2001)), as amended, it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. The Director of the Office of Unified Communications ("OUC") is delegated the authority to take any and all actions authorized to be performed by the Mayor under the Act.
2. The authority delegated herein to the Director of the OUC may be further delegated by the Director to subordinates under the Director of the OUC's jurisdiction.


SUBJECT: Delegations of Authority under Title II of D.C. Law 15-117, the "Child and Youth, Safety and Health Omnibus Temporary Act of 2004"

ORIGINATING AGENCY: Office of the Mayor


By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422 (2) and (6) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code §§ 1-204.22 (2) and (6) (2001), and pursuant to D.C. Law 15-117, the "Child and Youth, Safety and Health Omnibus Temporary Act of 2004" (the "Act"), effective March 30, 2004 (D.C. Act 15-304; 51 DCR 1359, February 6, 2004) it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. The Director, D.C. Office of Personnel, is delegated the authority vested in the Mayor in section 208 of Title II of the Act to issue rules governing the criminal background check requirement and traffic record check requirement for persons being considered for compensated or voluntary employment in positions in District government agencies covered under the Act, as well as rules governing the periodic criminal background check requirement in sections 203 and 205 of Title II of the Act for employees and volunteers in covered positions in these agencies.
2. The Director, D.C. Office of Personnel, is delegated authority to set forth procedures to inform persons being considered for compensated or voluntary employment in a covered position subject to a criminal background check, when and where to report for the check; provide persons with the forms to be utilized for the purposes listed in section 205 (b) of Title II of the Act concerning a criminal background check; and inform persons of their right to obtain a copy of the criminal background check report and challenge the accuracy and completeness of the report.
3. The Director, D.C. Office of Personnel, is also delegated authority to set forth procedures for the traffic record check requirement in section 204 of Title II of the Act, for persons being considered for compensated or voluntary employment in a covered position subject to the requirement.

4. The Chief Procurement Officer, Office of the Chief Procurement Officer, is delegated the authority vested in the Mayor in section 208 of Title II of the Act to issue rules governing the criminal background check requirement and the traffic record check requirement for persons and private agencies being considered for contractual work providing direct services to children and youth in covered agencies.
5. The heads of the following covered agencies, and the Executive Director in the case of the State Education Office of the Executive Office of the Mayor, are delegated the authority vested in the Mayor to evaluate reports of criminal background checks and traffic record checks required under the Act, and determine whether final offers of appointment should be made to persons being considered for compensated or voluntary employment:
 - Department of Human Services
 - Department of Health
 - Department of Parks and Recreation
 - Fire and Medical Services Department
 - Metropolitan Police Department
 - Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia
 - State Education Office of the Executive Office of the Mayor
 - Department of Mental Health
 - Child and Family Services Agency
6. The Metropolitan Police Department is designated as the agency responsible for conducting traffic record checks under section 204 of Title II of the Act and criminal background checks under sections 205 and 206 of Title II of the Act, and for developing internal operating procedures for the checks as well as a sliding fee schedule under section 212 (b) of the Act for the payment of the cost of criminal background checks, for agencies subordinate to the Mayor that are covered under the Act.
7. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Order shall become effective immediately.




SUBJECT: Revocation of Delegation of Authority to Deputy Mayor
for Planning and Economic Development

ORIGINATING AGENCY: Office of the Mayor

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by sections 422(2) and (6) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22 (2) and (6) (2001), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. The Mayor's Order executed on or about September 24, 2004, delegating to the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development the Mayor's authority to execute, on behalf of the District of Columbia government, one or more agreements with Major League Baseball ("MLB"), the Office of the Commissioner of Baseball, Baseball Expos, L.P., a MLB club, and related parties pertaining to the location of a MLB team in the District of Columbia, the construction of a stadium in the District of Columbia to accommodate the said MLB team, and for related purposes, hereby is revoked, and the said authority hereby reverts to the Mayor.
2. This Order supersedes the Mayor's Order referred to in the preceding Paragraph and any prior Mayor's Order to the extent of any inconsistency therein.
