Bill 15-349, the "Lease Approval Clarification Amendment Act of 2004" proposes to amend the District of Columbia Procurement Practices Act of 1985 to clarify that the Council has the authority to review and approve leases entered into on behalf of the District government involving expenditures in excess of \$1,000,000 per year and that the criteria for the review of lease which are approved pursuant to the Council review under section 451 of the Home Rule Act includes criteria listed under the District of Columbia Revenue Act of 1979; and to amend the District of Columbia Revenue Act of 1970 to repeal a duplicative provision involving the Council review of leases.

Bill 15-669, the "Procurement Practices Vendor Payment Revised Approval Authorization Amendment Act of 2004" proposes to amend the District of Columbia Procurement Practices Act of 1985 to modify the conditions under which payment of supplies or services received by the District Government without a valid written contract may be authorized.

Bill 15-483, the "Freedom of Information Legislative Records Clarification Amendment Act of 2004" proposes to amend the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act to bring the District's Freedom of Information Act into greater conformity with the federal Freedom of Information Act, to clarify that the Freedom of Information Act law enforcement or investigatory records exemption applies equally to the Council of the District of Columbia's investigatory proceedings, that the inter-agency memorandum

exemption applies to Council records, to provide that records containing the identity of the whistleblowers are exempt from disclosure, that the Council may assert exemptions on behalf of public bodies from which it receives information, and that final decisions of the Council may not be appealed to the Mayor.

Bill 15-668, the "Freedom of Information Council Consistency Act of 2004" proposes to amend the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act to bring the District's Freedom of Information Act into greater conformity with the Freedom of Information Act of 2004".

Bill 15-632, the "Use of Public Funds Responsibility and Accountability Amendment Act of 2004" proposes to amend the District of Columbia Procurement Practices Act of 1985 to require a person that is awarded a contract with or a grant from the District that authorizes the person to use public funds to appear and testify before the Council or a committee or subcommittee of the Council upon a request by the Chairman of the Council or a Chairman of a committee or a subcommittee regarding the use of those public funds.

Bill 15-567, the "District Government Reemployed Annuitant Offset Elimination Amendment Act of 2004" proposes to amend the District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act of 1978 to treat former District government employees who are federal annuitants the same as former federal government employees who are federal annuitants by eliminating the reduction in the pay of a former District government employee who is a reemployed federal annuitant.

Bill 15-751, the "Equitable Expansion of Health Care Benefits Amendment Act of 2004" proposes to Freedom of Information Legislative Records Clarification Amendment Act of 2004" proposes to amend the Health Care Benefits Expansion Act of 1992 to allow District employees hired before October 1, 1987 to acquire health benefits for their eligible family members. District government employees enrolled in the Federal Employees Health Care Benefits Program would be allowed to purchase family health insurance coverage that would cover the employee's family member in accordance with sections 2105, 2106, and 2107 (a), (c), and (d) of the District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act of 1978, effective October 1, 1987. The employee would be required to assume the total cost of the family health insurance coverage for the family member.

Bill 15-610, the "Help America Vote Act of 2004" proposes to amend the District of Columbia Election Code of 1955 to bring the District of Columbia into compliance with the Help America Vote Act of 2002.

Bill 15-566, the "Inspector General Appointment and Term Clarification Amendment Act of 2003" proposes to amend the District of Columbia Procurement Practices Act of 1985 to provide that the term of the Inspector General shall end in 2008 and shall not vary thereafter from a six year term and to provide upon Congressional approval that in a non-control year, the Inspector General may be removed for cause by the Mayor with the approval of 2/3 of the members of the members of the Council present and voting.
