Bill 15-726 modifies the membership and goals of the WCCAAC to take into account that the Convention Center is no longer in the planning or construction phases. The new advisory group would be made up of 11 members who will help advise the Washington Convention Center Authority on operational issues such as pedestrian movement projects, transportation and parking issues, and economic development objectives.

On Monday, March 1, 2004, at 1:00 p.m., in Room 412 of The John Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Ave, N.W., Councilmember Kevin P. Chavous, Chairman of the Committee on Education, Libraries and Recreation, will hold a Public Roundtable on Bill 15-714 School Governance Amendment Act of 2004.
