Councilmember Carol Schwartz, Chair of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment, announces a continuation of a Public Hearing on Parking Policy and the above-mentioned Bills. The Hearing will be held on Monday, September 29, 2003, at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber (Room 500) of the John Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue N.W., Washington, D.C. 20004. This Hearing has been scheduled to discuss five parking-related bills which have been referred to the Committee, and to hear from the public on a myriad of parking policy issues including, but not limited to, parking meters, parking around the new and old convention centers, abandoned vehicles and tour bus parking. In addition, this Hearing will seek input as the Committee reviews the residential permit parking program and will focus on issues such as limitations on time, as well as contractor home worker and visitor parking. Public testimony was received by the Committee on September 17th. However, due to preparations for Hurricane Isabel—and at the request of the Executive—the Committee did not hear testimony from, nor did it ask questions of, the Executive Branch.

Bill 15-220, the "Parking Meter Fee Moratorium Act of 2003," introduced by Councilmember Schwartz, continues the imposition of a parking meter fee moratorium all day Saturday and on other days between 6:30 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.

The purpose of **Bill 15-211, the "Traffic Adjudication Appeal Fee Amendment Act of 2003,"** introduced by Councilmember Schwartz, Chairman Cropp and Councilmembers Ambrose, Catania, Fenty, Mendelson, Allen, Brazil, Chavous, Graham and Orange, and co-sponsored by Councilmember Evans, is to provide for a refund of the fee for appealing a notice of traffic infraction to a person who prevails in an appeal. This is the permanent version of emergency and temporary legislation already enacted by the Council.

Bill 15-90, the "Parking Limitation for Out of State Vehicles Amendment Act of 2003," introduced by Councilmember Fenty, would amend Title 18 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations to limit the period of time vehicles with out-of-state license plates may park on a roadway to no more than 24 consecutive hours.

Bill 15-141, the "Parking Ticket Adjudication Hearing Amendment Act of 2003," introduced by Chairman Cropp at the request of the Mayor, would give adjudication hearing officers the discretion to determine whether to require the appearance of the issuer of a parking ticket at the hearing on the violation.

And **Bill 15-412, the "Parking Amendment Act of 2003,"** introduced by Councilmembers Mendelson, Allen, Ambrose, Chavous, Orange and Patterson, would prohibit the parking of motor vehicles on public space for more than 72 hours or in the front yard on private property, would give property owners a claim of title on abandoned and/or dangerous vehicles impounded from their property with their consent, and would require that motor vehicle auctioneers maintain a record of vehicles sold by vehicle identification number and purchaser.

Councilmember Sharon Ambrose, Chair, Committee on Consumer and Regulatory Affairs, announces a Public Hearing on the notice of proposed rulemaking published in the August 8, 2003 D.C. Register entitled "Intent to Adopt the D.C. Construction Codes of 2003; and New Title 12 Dcmr." and Bill 15-283, the "Elevators, Escalators and Other Automated People Movers Equipment Safety Act of 2003". The hearing will be held on Wednesday, October 22, 2003, starting at 10:00 a.m. in Room 412, John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

The notice of the proposed rulemaking was published in the August 8, 2003 District of Columbia Register for a 30-day public comment period and it will be transmitted to the Council for a 45-day review period as well. This hearing notice is being published prior to the formal transmittal to the Council of the proposed rulemaking to ensure sufficient notice for full public discussion to occur in the 45-day review period. The purpose of the Mayor's proposed rulemaking is to seek adoption of the listed construction codes which would be incorporated by reference and to repeal the District of Columbia Construction Codes adopted in 1999. Pursuant to Section 10 of the Construction Codes Approval and Amendments Act of 1986, effective March 21, 1987 (D.C. Law 6-216; D.C. Official Code § 6-1409), if the Council does not approve or disapprove the proposed rules, in whole or in part, by resolution within the 45-day review period, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, legal holidays, and days of Council recess, the proposed rules shall be deemed approved upon expiration of the 45-day period.

The District of Columbia Construction Codes of 2003 will consist of the International Code Council's (ICC) International Building Code 2000, and the 2000 editions of the ICC's

International Residential Code, International Fuel Gas Code, International Mechanical Code, International Plumbing Code, International Property Maintenance Code, International Fire Code, and International Energy Conservation Code, as well as the D.C. Existing Buildings Code Supplement of 2002, the 1996 edition of the NFPA National Electrical Code, and a new Title 12 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, the Construction Codes Supplement of 2003, which will include local variations to the adopted codes. Moreover, should the International Existing Building Code be adopted, its approval is subject to the 90-day review period provided for in the Homestart Regulatory Improvement Amendment Act of 2002, D.C. Law 14-162, effective June 25, 2002.

The hearing will provide an opportunity to review and discuss each of these codes, the local variations of the codes, and the work of the District of Columbia Building Code Advisory Committee which has already reviewed and modified each of them. Copies of the proposed rules are available for public inspection at the Washington Division of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Public Library, 901 G Street, NW, Washington, DC and at the Office of the Administrator, Building and Land Regulation Administration, Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs, 941 North Capitol Street, NE, Suite 200, Washington, DC.

The hearing will also include discussion of Bill 15-283, the "Elevators, Escalators and Other Automated People Movers Equipment Safety Act of 2003". The purpose of Bill 15-283 is to provide for the safety of life and to promote public safety awareness in the installation and operation of elevators, escalators and other automated people movers; to prevent the use of unsafe and defective lifting devices which impose a substantial probability of serious and preventable injury to employees and the public; to prevent injury and protect employees and the public from unsafe conditions as being in the best interests of the District of Columbia; to promote documentation of elevator personnel with training or experience to ensure familiarity with the operation and safety functions of the components and equipment; to establish minimum standards for elevator personnel; to create an Elevator Safety Review Board with the power to consult with engineering authorities and organizations concerned with standard safety codes and to recommend amendments to existing law and regulations for the equipment.

Councilmember Harold Brazil, Chairperson of the Committee on Economic Development, announces a public hearing on PR 15-352, "Vacant and Abandoned Properties Community Development Disposition Approval Resolution of 2003." The public hearing will be held at 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 16, 2003, in Room 412 at 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW.

PR 15-352 would authorize the Mayor to dispose of over 80 properties listed in the resolution through the District's Home Again Program. The Home Again Program was authorized by the Vacant and Abandoned Properties Community Development Act of 2002 ("Act"). Under the Act, the Mayor is authorized to dispose of certain vacant and abandoned properties in the District in order to return the properties to productive (and tax-producing uses) and to aid in the redevelopment of various neighborhoods throughout the District. The Mayor is authorized under the Act to dispose of single-household properties or multi-household properties of five units or fewer. The Act requires the Mayor to group the properties into bundles of 5 to 25 properties and to dispose of the properties pursuant to a request for proposals. Inclusion of properties in the Home Again Program must be approved by the Council by resolution. PR15-352 would constitute that approval for the 85 properties listed in the resolution.

The purpose of this hearing is to receive testimony from the government and the public on the proposed resolution. Council Chairman Linda W. Cropp announces the scheduling of a public hearing by the Committee of the Whole on PR 15-381, "Transfer of Jurisdiction of Part of U.S. Reservation 357 for the Mayor's Official Residence Resolution of 2003." The public hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, September 30, 2003, at 10:00 a.m., in the Council Chamber, located on the 5th floor of The John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

The hearing on this matter was originally scheduled on the same date and time for a very similar measure, PR 15-359, Transfer of Jurisdiction of U.S. Reservation 357 for the Mayor's Official Residence Resolution of 2003. However, due to an inadvertent error in the description of the land to be transferred that was contained in PR 15-359, a new resolution (PR 15-381) has been submitted by the Mayor to be considered by the Council in its place.

PR 15-381, introduced at the request of the Mayor, would accept the proposed transfer of jurisdiction from the U.S. National Park Service to the District of a 1.8-acre parcel of U.S. Reservation 357. Pursuant to a lease to be executed by the District, the parcel would be used by the Casey Foundation to provide additional security, ingress and egress, and landscaped area for the Mayor's official residence, which the Casey Foundation intends to develop and maintain on an adjoining 16.5-acre parcel that it owns at 1801 Foxhall Road, N.W.

The purpose of the Public Oversight Hearing is to receive a formal report from the District of Columbia Office of the Secretary concerning the status of its preparations for the District of Columbia Emancipation Day activities. The activities selected by the Office of the Secretary would commemorate the freeing of 3,100 District of Columbia slaves on April 16, 1862. This day is historically significant because President Abraham Lincoln signed into federal law the “District of Columbia Emancipation Act” ending slavery in the District of Columbia, nine months prior to signing the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863, which freed all slaves, nationally. The Council of the District of Columbia, unanimously passed legislation establishing April 16th as a private legal holiday in the District of Columbia and Mayor Anthony A. Williams signed the legislation into law and called upon residents to join him in striving to overcome prejudice and inhumanity.
