Council Chairman Vincent C. Gray announces a public hearing by the Committee of the Whole on Bill 17-914, the "Limitation on Borrowing and Establishment of the Operating Cash Reserve Act of 2008". The public hearing is scheduled for Monday, September 22, 2008, at 10:00 a.m., in Room 412 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W. Bill 17-914, introduced by Chairman Vincent C. Gray, amends Chapter 3 of Title 47 of the District of Columbia Official Code to establish a 12% limitation on borrowing, and to establish a \$50 million annual operating cash reserve to fund the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority's Fund upon its applicability.

Councilmember Jim Graham, Chairperson of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment, will convene a public hearing on B17-116, the "District Department of the Environment Comprehensive Lead-Based Paint Risk Reduction Act of 2007." The public hearing will be held on Wednesday, October 1, 2008 at 10:00 a.m. in Room 412 at the Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20004. **This hearing notice has been revised to change the time and location.**

This bill would amend the Lead-Based Paint Abatement and Control Act of 1996 to correct inconsistencies from the previous amendments and to align inspection and enforcement procedures with federal and surrounding jurisdictions. The bill would also help reduce the incidence of childhood lead poisoning by reducing exposure to lead-based paint hazards, establish duties for owners of property built prior to 1978 used as a rental dwelling, foster homes and child care facilities, authorize the establishment of lead-safe work practice requirements for contractors and establish a Lead Poisoning Prevention Fund.

On Friday, September 19, 2008, Councilmember Mary M. Cheh, Chairperson of the Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs, will hold a public roundtable on P.R. 17-866, the "Construction Codes Amendment Resolution of 2008." The public roundtable will begin at 10:00 AM in Room 120 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

This resolution would approve amendments to Title 12 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, replacing the existing Title 12 Construction Code Supplement of 2003, with a new Title 12, Construction Code Supplement of 2008. Pursuant to Section 10 of the Construction Codes Approval and Amendments Act of 1986, effective March 21, 1987 (D.C. Law 6-216; D.C. Official Code, § 6-1409), all proposed amendments to the Construction Codes must be submitted to the Council for a 45-day period of review.
