By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(11) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, as amended, approved December 24, 1973, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. No. 93-198, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22(11) (2001), and pursuant to 19 DCMR § 1100.1 (June 2001), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:


1. Commencing April 12, 2003, through December 28, 2003, every Sunday, between the hours of 7:00 A.M. through 3:00 P.M., a producer-only farmer's market may operate a farmer's market on the Riggs Bank parking lot located in the 1913 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W. (1500 block of 20<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W.) in Washington, D.C., specifically at Lot 60, Square 113, within the District of Columbia. This location is designated as a farmer's market to be used as a vending marketplace.
2. FreshFarm Markets is authorized to operate a farmer's market in this designated area, at the times specified.
3. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This order shall become effective immediately.



By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(6) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, as amended, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. No. 93-198; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22(6) (2001), and pursuant to section 14(a) of the "Office of Administrative Hearings Establishment Act of 2001" ("Act"), effective March 6, 2002, D.C. Law 14-76, D.C. Official Code § 2-1831.11(a), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. The Deputy Mayor for Public Safety and Justice is delegated the authority vested in the Mayor by section 14(a) of the Act to issue rules governing the appointment, reappointment, discipline, removal and qualifications of Administrative Law Judges in the Office of Administrative Hearings.

**SUBJECT:** Establishment and Composition of the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group; Joint Delegation of Personnel Authority

**ORIGINATING AGENCY:** Office of the Mayor

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by §§ 422 (2) and (3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, as amended, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 790, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22 (2) and (3)) (2001) and the District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act of 1978, effective March 3, 1979 (D.C. Law 2-139, D.C. Official Code § 1-601.01 et seq.) (2001) (hereinafter referred to as the "CMPA"), it is hereby ORDERED that:

- A. **ESTABLISHMENT:** There is established within the District of Columbia government, the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group.
- B. **PURPOSE OF THE HUMAN RESOURCES REFORM AND DECISION GROUP:**

The Deciding Members of the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group shall assist the Mayor by providing strategic direction to the District government and making decisions for the improvement of current human resources policies, processes and automated personnel systems.

The functions listed in Paragraph H of this Order shall be considered as "human resources" for the purposes of the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group: personnel, labor relations, pay, retirement, and the supporting technical systems for these functions.

- C. **DELEGATION OF PERSONNEL AUTHORITY TO CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE HUMAN RESOURCES REFORM AND DECISION GROUP:**

Notwithstanding Paragraphs A and B of Mayor's Order 2000-83, dated May 30, 2000, the Director of the D.C. Office of Personnel and the members of the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group listed in Paragraph G of this Order are delegated the authority vested in the Mayor under § 406 (b) of the CMPA (D.C. Official Code § 1-604.06 (b)) (2001) to function as personnel authority for the sole purpose of accomplishing the functions of the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group specified in this Order.

**D. ADVISORY MEMBERS OF THE HUMAN RESOURCES REFORM AND DECISION GROUP:**

The entities listed in Paragraph E of this Order may, at their option upon request from the Mayor or his designee, be Advisory Members of the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group. They have been selected because of the background and experience they can contribute to matters being considered by the group. The exclusive role of the Advisory Members shall be to participate in discussions of and make non-binding recommendations to the Deciding Members of the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group listed in Paragraph G of this Order, upon their request. Advisory Members shall not participate in decision-making with respect to matters concerning the Mayor's personnel authority specified as part of the functions of the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group. Accordingly, the provisions of Paragraph C of this Order shall not apply to the Advisory Members.

Others as designated by the City Administrator

**F. RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN SUBORDINATE AGENCIES AND THE HUMAN RESOURCES REFORM AND DECISION GROUP:**

Subordinate agencies shall submit for review and approval all proposed new or revised human resources policies and procedures to the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group before adopting or implementing such changes.

**G. COMPOSITION – DECIDING MEMBERS:**

The City Administrator shall chair the Human Resources Reform and Decision Group. The Group shall be comprised of senior level officials representing the following agencies:

D.C. Office of Personnel

Office of Pay and Retirement Services



Office of the Chief Financial Officer

Office of Labor Relations and Collective Bargaining

Office of Budget and Planning

Office of the Chief Technology Officer

**H. FUNCTIONS:**

1. Resolve fundamental human resources issues on a District-wide basis by dealing with, among others, the following systemic problems:
    - (a) Lack of an integrated or inclusive process for governing or guiding improvements in policy, procedures, processes, and automated systems.
    - (b) Fragmentation and decentralization of functions, especially as it pertains to personnel and labor relations, leading to lack of clarity concerning authority and accountability.
    - (c) Overly complex personnel, labor relations, benefits, pay and pension regulations and "business rules."
    - (d) Lack of robust and modern human resources management processes and automated systems.
  2. Determine the types of human resources automated systems to be purchased by District government agencies to ensure compatibility with the Administrative Services Modernization Program (ASMP).
  3. Meet on a regular basis to discuss specific issues, consider recommended changes, decide the course of action to be taken, make recommendations to the Mayor, and monitor implementation.
- I. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Order shall become effective immediately.
