NOTICE OF PUBLIC COMMENT ON CONSENT DECREE IN
DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA v. CSX TRANSPORTATION, INC.

Notice is hereby given that a Consent Decree in District of Columbia v. CSX Transportation, Inc., is available for public comment. The Decree, executed by the parties on or about September 4, 2008, will fully resolve claims against CSXT contained in a Complaint the District will file simultaneously with the Decree in D.C. Superior Court. The Complaint, filed on behalf of the District Department of the Environment ("DDOE") under the District's Water Pollution Control Act, D.C. Official Code §§ 8-103.01, *et seq.*, alleges that the November 9, 2007 derailment, during which six CSXT railcars and some or all of the railcars' contents spilled into the Anacostia River, constituted unauthorized discharges of one or more pollutants into the waters of the District.

Pursuant to the Decree, CSXT will pay a civil penalty of \$50,000; will reimburse the District \$60,561.79 for its costs; will contribute \$50,000.00 towards performance of a project or projects to restore natural resources potentially damaged by CSXT's alleged acts or omissions ("Natural Resources Restoration Project(s)"); and will contribute \$500,000.00 towards performance of a Supplemental Environmental Project or Projects ("SEP(s)") to benefit the Anacostia River ecosystem. The District will submit the \$550,000 for the SEP and Natural Resources Restoration Project to the National Fish & Wildlife Foundation ("Foundation"), a charitable, non-profit, tax-exempt corporation, which will create and manage an account, to be known as the "Anacostia River Endowment Fund," into which it shall deposit the \$550,000, as well as other potential contributions from other sources, and disburse the Fund's contents as directed by the District to fund environmental projects and initiatives designed to protect, preserve, and restore the environment and ecosystems in the Anacostia River, including wetlands, stream banks, riparian buffers and associated watersheds.

For thirty (30) days after this publication, DDOE will receive comments relating to this Consent Decree. All comments must be submitted in writing via mail to the District Department of the Environment, Watershed Protection Division, 51 N Street, N. E., 5th Floor, Washington D.C. 20001, Attention: Hamid Karimi, or by e-mail to hamid.karami@dc.gov. In either case, the comments must be filed by COB October 14, 2008, and should refer to District of Columbia v. CSX Transportation, Inc.. Additionally, a copy of the Consent Decree may be examined at the DDOE, Watershed Protection Division, 51 N Street, N.E., 5th Floor.

The District's determination to solicit public comment on this settlement does not constitute a determination by the District that it is required to solicit public input in its settlement decisions in this case or in any other environmental or non-environmental enforcement action.

The Community-Based Violence Reduction Fund (CBVRF). *The Office of the City Administrator/Justice Grants Administration (JGA)* announces the availability of up to \$475,000 in grant funds to promote a focused, coordinated community response to violent crime in the Mayor's Focused Improvement Areas (FIAs).

The mission of the FIA pilot initiative is to reduce criminal activity and increase quality of life in at-risk communities by combining community-policing efforts with the coordinated delivery of human services. The goal of the CBVRF is to reduce violence by encouraging collaborative efforts between communities and law enforcement, prosecution, judiciary, and private, nonprofit victim services agencies to address violence in at-risk communities. Program design should reflect familiarity with the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) Comprehensive Gang Model and a commitment to collaborating with District of Columbia Government Agencies. Interested, eligible applicants should also plan programs that include solicitation and adoption of community feedback to ensure that community needs are reflected in program design.

Summary: Serve DC announces the availability of AmeriCorps*State Competitive funding for fiscal year 2009–2010 to eligible organizations. New applicants with high-quality proposals will compete nationally with other State and National programs for \$40,328,000 of funds made available through Serve DC and the Corporation on National and Community Service (Corporation). The total amount of the grant must not exceed \$12,600 per Member Service Years. Interested applicants can access Serve DC’s prime application in eGrants by visiting www.americorps.gov.

AmeriCorps is a national service network that provides full- and less than full-time opportunities for participants, called members, to serve their communities and build the capacity of nonprofit organizations to meet local environmental, educational, public safety, homeland security, or other human needs. Within these five issue areas, programs may submit proposals that address specific problems of local communities.

In the FY 2009 competition, the Corporation will give special consideration to projects that address one or a combination of five strategic initiatives, listed below, that meet critical needs of our nation, achieve national service goals, and address community problems.

1. Mobilizing more volunteers.
2. Ensuring a brighter future for all of America’s youth.
3. Engaging students in communities.
4. Harnessing Baby Boomers’ experience.
5. Helping communities recover from and prepare for disasters.

In 2009, the Corporation will also give special consideration to programs designed to engage veterans as service recipients or providers.

Match Requirement: All program costs require at least a 24% cash or in-kind match during each of the first three years of funding, with match requirements increasing incrementally after year three. Programs reach a maximum 50% minimum match level during the 10th year of funding.

Criteria for Eligible Applicants: Eligible applicants are local nonprofit organizations and/or state and local units of government. Programs applying to Serve DC for funding *must* operate the program only within the District of Columbia.

An organization described in Section 501 (c) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. 501 (c) (4), that engages in lobbying activities is not eligible to apply, serve as a host site for members, or act in any type of supervisory role in the program. **Individuals are not eligible to apply.**
