Councilmember Jim Graham, Chairperson of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment, will convene a public hearing on the “Lead Hazard Prevention and Elimination Act of 2008.” The public hearing will be held on Wednesday, October 1, 2008 at 10:00 a.m. in Room 412 at the Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20004. **This hearing notice has been abbreviated to provide notice to the public.**

This bill would amend the Lead-Based Paint Abatement and Control Act of 1996 and strengthens previously introduced bill 17-0116 “District Department of Environment Comprehensive Lead-Based Paint Risk Reduction Act of 2007” by including recommendations from pediatricians, families and advocates. The bill will help reduce the incidence of childhood lead poisoning by reducing exposure to lead-based paint hazards, establish duties for owners of property built prior to 1978 used as a rental dwellings, foster homes and child care facilities, authorize the establishment of lead-safe work practice requirements for contractors, create the position of Lead Dust Sampling Technician and establish a Lead Poisoning Prevention Fund.

The stated purpose of Bill 17-431 is to amend Title 16 of the District of Columbia Code to provide speedy trial rights for juveniles ordered to shelter care. The Council adopted emergency and temporary legislation in December 2007 to extend speedy trial rights to juveniles ordered to shelter care, and required a study to evaluate the effects of this legislation in order to inform the permanent bill that is the subject of this hearing. The study will be completed and provided to the Council in mid-September.

The stated purpose of Bill 17-913 is to create oversight in the process for adjudicating juveniles as adults by adding a reverse waiver provision and preserving Family Division jurisdiction over subsequent juvenile cases. The legislation also ends the pre-trial placement of youth in the adult D.C. Jail.
