Bill 17-942, introduced by Chairman Gray, would require the Chancellor of District of Columbia Public Schools to make an estimate of the amount of money that will be required to operate the public schools in the upcoming year available on its website and in each school no later than 21 days prior to the Mayor's submission of the District's budget and financial plan to the Council; require the Chancellor to solicit public input prior to the submission of the District of Columbia Public Schools budget to the Mayor and require the Mayor to conduct a public hearing on public school funding prior to the Mayor's submission of the District's budget and financial plan to the Council; and to delineate the allocations of monies required in the District of Columbia Public Schools budget submitted by the Chancellor.

Bill 17-675, the “Promotion of Affordable Housing Investment Amendment Act of 2008”, amend section 302b of the District of Columbia Real Estate Deed Recordation Tax Act to exempt certain affordable-housing investments from the deed recordation tax on transfers of economic interest.

Bill 17-774, the “New Convention Center Hotel Technical Amendments Act of 2008”, would amend the Washington Convention Center Authority Act of 2004 to reinsert lease provisions for the new convention center hotel and to authorize an underground airspace lease in addition to vault permits, and to amend Title 47 of the District of Columbia Official Code to insert a phrase related to a tax exemption.

Bill 17-859, the “Tax Revenue Anticipation Notes Act of 2008”, would authorize the issuance of District of Columbia general obligation tax revenue anticipation notes to finance general governmental expenses for the FY 2009 fiscal year.

Bill 17-876, the “National Law Enforcement Museum Sales and Use Tax Credit Act of 2008”, would grant a sales and use tax credit to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc., and its vendors, arising from gross receipts at the National Law Enforcement Museum.

Bill 17-783, the “Washington Parks & People Equitable Real Property Tax Relief Act of 2008”, would provide equitable real property tax relief to certain property owned by Washington Parks & People, a tax-exempt organization, and used as a public park.

Bill 17-916, the “Targeted Historic Preservation Assistance Amendment Act of 2008”, would amend the Targeted Historic Preservation Assistance Amendment Act of 2006 to exempt historic housing grants from computation as gross taxable income.

Bill 17-947, the “Rhode Island Avenue Metro Plaza Revenue Bonds Approval Amendment Act of 2008”, would amend the Rhode Island Avenue Metro Plaza Revenue Bonds Approval Act of 2008 and section 47-4613 of the DC Code to modify the definitions of the terms “owner” and “project”, to clarify the purposes for which the bond proceeds may be used, to require the creation of separate accounts within the Rhode Island Avenue Metro Plaza PILOT Fund, to clarify that the payment in lieu of taxes includes both real property taxes and possessory interest taxes, and to reduce the amount of the construction sales tax abatement.

Bill 17-968, the “CEMI-Ridgecrest – Walter Washington Community Center Real Property Tax Exemption and Equitable Real Property Tax Relief Act of 2008”, would amend Chapter 46 of Title 47 of the District of Columbia Official Code to exempt from taxation certain property of CEMI-Ridgecrest, Inc.-Walter Washington Community Center, and to provide equitable real property tax relief.

The bill would also authorize the Director of DDOE to convene the Stormwater Advisory Panel. The bill would also establish a Technical Working Group consisting of representatives of District agencies, advocates and residents. Bill 17-980 would also modify the stormwater user fee structure to a city-wide impervious area methodology, and require the Mayor to offer financial assistance programs to mitigate the impact of increases in stormwater user fees on low-income residents of the District.
