Notice of Reprogramming Disapproval

Councilmember Mendelson and Councilmember Barry filed on October 27, 2008, PR 17-1140 the "Reprogramming No. 17-163 Disapproval Resolution of 2008" to disapprove Reprogramming 17-163. The request to reprogram \$2,000,000 of FY 2008 Local funds from the Department of Corrections (DOC) to the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department (FEMS) was filed in the Chairman's Office on October 17, 2008. This reprogramming is needed to cover costs associated with overtime in FEMS.

The disapproval resolution extends the Council's review period to 30 days, ending on Tuesday, November 18, 2008. If the Council does not adopt a resolution of approval or disapproval during this period, the reprogramming will be deemed approved on Wednesday, November 19, 2008.

Notice of Reprogramming Disapproval

Councilmember Graham and Chairman Gray filed on October 27, 2008, PR 17-1141 the "Reprogramming of \$2,000,000 for the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department Disapproval Resolution of 2008" to disapprove Reprogramming 17-162. The request to reprogram \$20,000,000 of capital budget authority from the Washington Metropolitan Area Transportation Authority (WMATA) to the District Department of Transportation (DDOT) for the East Washington streetcar project and within WMATA for the System Access/Capacity Program project was filed in the Chairman's Office on October 10, 2008. This reprogramming is needed to extend the initial line segment from the Anacostia Station, along Howard Road and Martin Luther King, Jr. Avenue, to Good Hope Road.

The disapproval resolution extends the Council's review period to 30 days, ending on Wednesday, November 12, 2008. If the Council does not adopt a resolution of approval or disapproval during this period, the reprogramming will be deemed approved on Thursday, November 13, 2008.
