Councilmember David A. Catania, Chair of the Committee on Health, announces a Public Hearing on B18-32: Practice of Occupational Therapy Amendment Act of 2009, B18-33: Practice of Polysomnography Amendment Act of 2009, B18-35: Practice of Psychology Amendment Act of 2009, B18-39: Practice of Nursing Amendment Act of 2009; and B18-90: Health Occupations Revision Act General Amendment Act of 2009. The hearing will be held on Monday, February 2, 2009 at 10:00 a.m., in Room 500, of the John Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW.

The purpose of this public hearing is to address four bills pertaining to the regulation of health professionals. B18-32: Practice of Occupational Therapy Amendment Act of 2009 amends the Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985 to amend the definition of the practice of occupational therapy, to provide for the regulation of Dance Therapy and Recreation Therapy by the Board of Occupational Therapy, to substitute a recreation therapist for an occupational therapy assistant on the Board of Occupational Therapy, and to update the educational requirements. B18-33: Practice of Polysomnography Amendment Act of 2009 amends the Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985 to define the practice of polysomnography, to provide for the regulation of polysomnography by the Board of Medicine, to establish an Advisory Committee on Polysomnography, and to require the Advisory Committee on Polysomnography to develop and submit guidelines relating to the practice of polysomnography. B18-35: Practice of Psychology Amendment Act of 2009 amends the Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985 to change the definition of the practice of psychology, and to provide for registration of psychology associates. B18-39: Practice of Nursing Amendment Act of 2009 amends the Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985 to amend the definition of the practice of advanced practice registered nursing, to define the practice by nursing assistive personnel, to amend the definition of the practice of practical nursing, to amend the definition of the practice of registered

nursing, to redefine the standards for the approval of nursing schools and programs, to establish the position of Executive Director for the Board of Nursing, and to provide for the registration of nursing assistive personnel in accordance with standards promulgated by Mayor. Finally, B18-90: Health Occupations Revision Act General Amendment Act of 2009 represents primarily technical amendments to the Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985. Most of the legislation inserts language for "registration" and "certification" for many fields of practice, but some changes are made to Boards and other professions that are not addressed in other HORA-related legislation.

Council Chairman Vincent C. Gray announces a public hearing by the Committee of the Whole on PR 18-46 (formerly PR 17-1229), the "Brookland/CUA Metro Station Small Area Plan Approval Resolution of 2009." The hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, February 10, 2009, at 3:00 p.m., in the Council Chamber, Room 500 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue NW. An abbreviated notice is being provided to comply with Council Rule 424.

PR 18-46, introduced by Chairman Gray at the request of the Mayor, would approve a small area plan to guide growth, development and revitalization of underutilized areas within a quarter mile or ten minute walk of the Brookland/CUA Metro Station in Ward 5. The planning area is bounded on the north by Taylor Street NE, on the east by 13th Street NE, on the south by Rhode Island Avenue NE, and on the west by 7th Street NE to Michigan Avenue to John McCormack Road. The plan includes specific land use and zoning recommendations designed to achieve the following outcomes: expansion of new neighborhood serving retail and housing choices; increases in population and foot traffic to support existing retail along 12th Street NE; inclusion of open spaces within new development; improvements in streetscape, signage, infrastructure and transit facilities; and restoration of the historic vitality of this unique neighborhood.

Through DDOT's Parking Meter Management Services Contract (POKA-2005-C-0048-KH), the District operates over 16,000 meters which generate significant revenue for transportation infrastructure maintenance and operations. These parking meters also manage the use of the District's limited curbside parking resources. The Parking Meter Management Services Contract defines parking meter performance and monitoring requirements as well as other contractor obligations. This hearing will address whether the contractor and District government are meeting obligations with respect to parking meter performance.
