

Notice of Reprogramming Disapproval

Councilmember Thomas filed on February 26, 2009, PR 18-134 the "Reprogramming No. 18-8 Disapproval Resolution of 2009" to disapprove Reprogramming 18-8. The request to reprogram \$1,200,000 of capital budget authority and allotment within the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on February 24, 2009. This reprogramming is needed to ensure adequate funding is available to complete an athletic playing field that meets industry standards and recreational standards of the District of Columbia.

The disapproval resolution extends the Council's review period to 30 days, ending on Thursday, March 26, 2009. If the Council does not adopt a resolution of approval or disapproval during this period, the reprogramming will be deemed approved on Friday, March 27, 2009.
