

Notice of Reprogramming Disapproval

Chairman Gray filed on March 10, 2009, PR 18-164 the "Reprogramming No. 18-7 Approval Resolution of 2009" to disapprove Reprogramming 18-7. The request to reprogram \$4,823,288 in capital budget authority and allotment within the Office of State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on February 24, 2009. The reprogramming will support the creation of the Statewide Longitudinal Education Data System (SLED).

The disapproval resolution extends the Council's review period to 30 days, ending on Thursday, March 26, 2009. If the Council does not adopt a resolution of approval or disapproval during this period, the reprogramming will be deemed approved on Friday, March 27, 2009.
