On Wednesday, May 20, 2009, Councilmember Jim Graham, Chairperson of the Committee on Public Works and Transportation, will convene a public hearing on the Bill 18-057, “Residential Parking Protection Pilot Act of 2009” and Bill 18-153, the “Commercial Curbside Loading Zone Implementation Act of 2009”.

The “Residential Parking Protection Pilot Act of 2009” would establish a Ward 1 Enhanced Residential Parking Zone, to allow households within this zone receive visitor parking placards, to require that one side residential streets within this zone be reserved for Zone 1 parking permit holders, and to modify RPP permit fees in Ward 1.

The “Commercial Curbside Loading Zone Implementation Act of 2009” would require enhanced management and enforcement of commercial loading zones including meter pricing, meter restrictions, enforcement, fines, and improved distribution of loading zones.

PR 18-180, introduced by Chairman Gray at the request of the Mayor, would approve a small area plan for the Center City's NoMA neighborhood. The planning area, located within portions of Wards 5 and 6, is bounded: on the south by F Street NE, Columbus Circle and Massachusetts Avenue; on the west by K Street NW and North Capitol Street; on the north by Q Street NE, Eckington Place NE, R Street NE, 3rd Street NE, Randolph Place NE, 4th Street NE, and T Street NE; and on the east by the CSX and Amtrak railroad tracks, Florida Avenue NE, 4th Street NE, M Street NE, and 3rd Street NE. The plan, which has been developed by the Office of Planning in collaboration with property owners, residents of surrounding neighborhoods, utility providers, WMATA, federal agencies and District agencies, provides a strategic framework for coordinated mixed use development of 20 million square feet of space in NoMA over the next 10 years.

The law provides that a parent in crisis may anonymously surrender a newborn, up to 7 days old, where there is no actual or suspected abuse or neglect, to a hospital without being charged with abuse, neglect, or abandonment of the newborn.

PR 18-179, the "Georgetown University Refunding. Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2009" was introduced by Chairman Gray at the request of the Mayor. It would authorize and provide for the issuance, sale, and delivery in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$160 million of the District of Columbia revenue bonds in one or more series and not to authorize and provide for the loan of the proceeds of such bonds to assist Georgetown University in the financing, refinancing, or reimbursing of costs associated with an authorized project pursuant to section 490 of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act. Proceeds of the bonds will be used to finance the refunding of existing 1999A revenue bonds due to current market issues. The institution is located at 37th and O Street, N.W., in Ward 2.

PR 18-195, the "The Urban Institute Revenue Bonds Project Approval Resolution of 2009" was introduced by Chairman Gray at the request of the Mayor. It would authorize and provide for the issuance, sale, and delivery in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$61 million of the District of Columbia revenue bonds in one or more series and not to authorize and provide for the loan of the proceeds of such bonds to assist The Urban Institute in the financing, refinancing, or reimbursing of costs associated with an authorized project pursuant to section 490 of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act. Proceeds of the bonds will be used for the acquisition, construction, renovation, upgrading, build-out, equipping and furnishing of a building located at 1100 1st Street, N.E., in Ward 6.
