**NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING**

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (“Board”), pursuant to the authority set forth in D.C. Official Code § 25-712(b) (2001) hereby gives notice of the adoption of proposed rules that create a new section 719 of Title 23 of the DCMR to require the holder of a retailer’s license to post in a conspicuous place, a warning sign regarding the dangers of drinking and driving.

The Board gives notice of its intent to adopt these proposed rules in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the D.C. Register. Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-211(b)(2) (2008 Supp.), these proposed rules are also being transmitted to the Council of the District of Columbia, and the final rules may not become effective until the expiration of the ninety (90) day period of Council review or upon approval by Council resolution, whichever occurs first.

Title 23 DCMR, Chapter 7 (General Operating Requirements), is amended by adding a new section 719 to read as follows:

**719 POSTING OF DRINKING AND DRIVING WARNING SIGN**

- 719.1 The holder of a retailer’s license shall post in a conspicuous place, a sign which reads: “Please do not drink and drive. Driving While Intoxicated or Under the Influence is illegal in the District of Columbia.”
- 719.2 The Board shall prepare the signs and make them available at no charge to licensees.
- 719.3 Each day of noncompliance shall constitute a secondary tier violation.

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**NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING**

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (“Board”), pursuant to the authority set forth in D.C. Official Code § 25-211(b) (2008 Supp.) and § 25-830(e)(2001) hereby gives notice of the adoption of proposed rules that create a new section 806 of Title 23 of the DCMR to clarify what constitutes an “egregious” first-time sale to minor violation.

The Board gives notice of its intent to adopt these proposed rules in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the D.C. Register. Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-211(b)(2008 Supp.), these proposed rules are also being transmitted to the Council of the District of Columbia, and the final rules may not become effective until the expiration of the ninety (90) day period of Council review or upon approval by Council resolution, whichever occurs first.

Title 23 DCMR, Chapter 8 (Enforcement, Infractions, and Penalties), is amended by adding a new section 806 to read as follows:

**806 SALE TO MINOR VIOLATIONS**

806.1 The Board may give warnings for first-time sale to minor offenses, excluding “egregious” sale to minor violations. Egregious shall be defined as “a sale to minor violation where the licensee: (1) sold or served an alcoholic beverage to a minor who was unable to produce a valid identification after a request from the licensee to do so, or (2) did not ask the minor for identification or (3) intentionally sold an alcoholic beverage to a minor, or (4) sold or served alcoholic beverages to a minor who presents identification indicating that the individual is under 21 years old.”

**NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING**

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board), pursuant to the authority set forth in D.C. Official Code §§ 25-211(b), 25-830(f) (2008 Supp.) and Mayor’s Order 2001-96 (June 28, 2001) as revised by Mayor’s Order 2001-102 (July 23, 2001), hereby gives notice of the intent to adopt the following proposed rules that would amend the existing ABRA civil penalty schedule set forth in section 800 of Title 23 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (“DCMR”). The proposed rules are intended to update the ABRA civil penalty schedule, which has not been revised since 2004. The proposed rules would also make it a secondary tier violation when a licensee does not comply with the operating hours on both its license application and entertainment endorsement application. Additionally, the proposed rules clarify that the one-year auditing period is based on a calendar year. Finally, the proposed rules prohibit the holder of a caterer’s license who also holds an on-premises retailer’s license from selling or serving alcohol under its caterer’s license on property owned, leased, or rented by the on-premises retailer.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-211(b)(2) (2001), these proposed rules are also being transmitted to the Council of the District of Columbia, for a ninety (90) day period of review. The proposed rules will become effective in not less than thirty (30) days from publication of this notice in the D.C. Register, or upon approval by the Council by resolution, whichever occurs later. If the Council does not approve or disapprove the proposed rules by resolution, in whole or in part, within the ninety (90) day review period, the proposed rules shall be deemed disapproved.

**Chapter 7 (General Operating Requirements) of Title 23 (April 2004) is amended by adding a new section 719 to read as follows:**

**“719. HOURS OF OPERATION**

719.1 A licensee shall be required to follow the operating hours listed on both its license application and entertainment endorsement application. It shall be a secondary tier violation for a licensee to exceed its listed hours of operation.

Title 23 DCMR is amended by replacing section 800 in its entirety to read as follows:

**Chapter 20 (Catering License) of Title 23 (April 2004) is amended by adding a new subsection 2000.4 to read as follows:**

2000.4 The holder of a Caterer's license who also holds an on-premises retailer's license shall not be permitted to sell or serve alcoholic beverages under its Caterer's license on property owned, leased, or rented by the on-premises retailer.

**Chapter 21 (Restaurant and Hotel Food Sales Requirements) of Title 23 (April 2004) is amended by adding a new sentence to the end of subsection 2101.2 to read as follows:**

“The one-year auditing period shall be based on a calendar year (January – December)”

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

The Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation, pursuant to the authority set forth in section 5(b) of the Recreation Act of 1994, effective March 23, 1995 (D.C. Law 10-246; D.C. Official Code § 10-304(b))(2001), hereby gives notice of the intent to adopt, in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication in the D.C. Register, the following rules to amend Chapter 7 of the D.C. Municipal Regulations.

This amendment is necessary to establish adjusted fees to cover expenses incidental to the promotion of recreation programs, and not met through public appropriations.

**Subsections 716.5 through 716.7 of Chapter 7 of Title 19 (Amusements, Parks and Recreation) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations are amended to read as follows:**

716.5 The following shall be fees for providing and maintaining recreational facilities.

The Board of Trustees of the University of the District of Columbia pursuant to the authority set forth under §201(a) of the District of Columbia Public Postsecondary Education Reorganization Act Amendments (“Act”) effective January 2, 1976 (D.C. Law 1-36; D.C. Official Code § 38-1202.01), and D.C. Official Code § 38-1202.06, hereby gives notice of its intent to amend Section 728 of Chapter 7 of Title 8, DCMR entitled “Tuition and Fees” in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the D.C. Register. The purpose of the proposed rule is to amend two (2) fees, the student health insurance fee and the Tuition Management System fee. These two (2) fees are not subject to the University’s control and accordingly are not appropriate to be listed on a fixed-cost basis in the tuition and fee schedule.

**The Board of Trustees of the University of the District of Columbia hereby proposes to amend Section 728 of Chapter 7 of Title 8, DCMR, as follows:**

**Section 728.4**

Amend § 728.4(q) (Student Health Insurance) by striking “\$175.00” and inserting in its place “Varies.”.

Amend § 728.4(t) (Tuition Management System) by striking “\$30.00” and inserting in its place “Varies.”.
