On Friday, May 29, 2009, Councilmember Mary M. Cheh, Chairperson of the Committee on Government Operations and the Environment, and Kwame R. Brown, Chairperson of the Committee on Economic Development, will hold a public hearing on Bill 18-76, the "Public Land Surplus Standards Amendment Act of 2009" and Bill 18-280, the "Southeastern Bus Garage Relocation Act of 2009." B18-76 would amend An Act Authorizing the Sale of Certain Real Estate in the District of Columbia No Longer Required for Public Purposes and the Master Facilities Planning and Program Coordination Advisory Act of 2003 to create standards that must be met prior to classifying public property as surplus, and to empower a committee to compile findings to create criteria for the surplussing of public property. B18-280 would declare as surplus property and dispose of certain District-owned real property to the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority to effectuate the relocation of the Southeastern Bus Garage. The public hearing will begin at 11:00 AM in Room 500 of the John A. Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

Councilmember Muriel Bowser, Chair of the Committee on Public Services and Consumer Affairs, announces a Public Hearing on B18-257: Vending Regulation Act of 2009. The hearing will be held on Tuesday, June 9, 2009 at 2:30 p.m., in Room 412, of the John Wilson Building, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW.

B18-257 would reestablish a vibrant vending program in the District of Columbia that is fair to vendors and businesses and safe for residents and visitors. The bill would permanently lift the vending moratorium, permit vending only from designated locations, authorize the Mayor to charge fees for permits and licenses, authorize pilot vending programs within designated areas, grandfather existing vendors, provide a preference for vendors at the Nationals Ballpark, and authorize the regulation of public markets. The bill is intended to create a vending program that clearly instructs District vendors and provides District residents and visitors safe and varied food, goods, and services.

The Hearing will be open to the public; however, only those witnesses invited to provide testimony will be allowed to testify. The applicant, the Association for the Preservation of Historic Congressional Cemetery on behalf of Christ Church, seeks the street closure in order to develop the site by repaving the deteriorated street that lies within the cemetery's fence, construction of a columbaria to serve the community's need for future interments, to construct a national cemetery conservation and visitor's center for the study of historic preservation methodologies, to incorporate a visitors heritage center at the conservation facility to enhance the Anacostia Waterfront cultural resources, and to construct a grand gateway to invite the riverfront community to explore the history with the Congressional Cemetery.
