If such notice is given, a reprogramming will become effective on the 31st day after its official receipt unless a resolution of approval or disapproval is adopted by the Council prior to that time.

Reprog. 18-39: Request to reprogram \$8,309,272 of Special Purpose Revenue funds budget authority within the D.C. Lottery and Charitable Games Control Board (DCLB) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on July 14, 2009. This reprogramming will realign the DCLB budget, moving it from areas of lower-than-anticipated revenue collections (including the D.C. Four and Powerball games) to other gaming and administrative categories.

Reprog. 18-40: Request to reprogram \$25,000 of Local funds budget authority to the Board of Real Property Assessment and Appeals (BRPAA) from the Office of Zoning (OZ) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on July 14, 2009. This reprogramming will cover severance pay and terminal leave payments to an employee who separated from the agency this fiscal year.

Reprog. 18-41: Request to reprogram \$2,000,000 of Local funds budget authority within the Department of Human Services (JA0) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on July 15, 2009. This reprogramming will make funding available to support the Community Partnership contract for homeless services in the Homeless Services Administration.

RECEIVED: 14 day review began July 16, 2009

Reprog. 18-42: Request to reprogram \$1,500,000 of capital budget authority and allotment from the Development of Health (DOH) and within the Office of Property Management to complete the Ward 1 Wellness Center at Georgia Avenue (EA129C) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on July 16, 2009. This reprogramming will transfer a total of \$1,500,000 of capital budget authority, which includes \$850,133 from the DOH/Community Clinic (HC501C), which is available because activity of this project has been much slower than anticipated; and \$267,854 from the Window Replacement Pool (PL603C) and \$982,013 from the HVAC Pool (PL601C), because funds are not needed in these projects in FY2009 for the original purposes of each project.

Reprog. 18-43: Request to reprogram \$10,000 of Special Purpose Revenue funds budget authority from the District of Columbia Commission on the Arts and Humanities (DCCAH) to the Office of Planning was filed in the Office of the Secretary on July 16, 2009. This reprogramming will move budget authority from the District of Columbia Commission on the Arts and Humanities to the Office of Planning.

Reprog. 18-44: Request to reprogram \$41,035,796.67 of Fiscal Year 2009 Local funds budget authority within the Non-Public Tuition Agency, which is administered by the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) was filed in the Office of the Secretary on July 20, 2009. This reprogramming will move funding within the agency to reflect the improved budget structure that the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) has developed that allows for improved tracking and reporting of the expenditures.
